CHURCHES FAVOR THE WORLD COURT

COLUMBUS, Ohio, Dec. 14.—The "messages of the churches to America" is contained in the "declaration of ideals and principles" submitted today to the annual meeting of the executive committee of the federal council of churches by its commission on international justice and good will. The declaration calls on the churches to carry on their campaign for a "warless world" which is to be brought about step by step and asks all Christians to pray and study for good will.

The declaration again calls upon the United States to enter the world court, to accept its full share of responsibility in an effective international organization for the just and peaceful settlement of international difficulties and the promotion of international security, confidence and good will. It also urges the government of the United States to cooperate fully with all other humanitarian commissions of the League of Nations.

Seen Chaos for U. S. A.
CHICAGO, Dec. 14.—Robert E. L. Sauer, president of the American Bar association, asserted that through constitutional amendment and federal encroachment the American form of government is being changed from a republic into a political chaos and urged lawyers to defend "the ancient landmarks of our government."

CHURCHES TO AID STARVING GERMANS

COLUMBUS, Ohio, Dec. 14.—Millions in Germany will be confronted with starvation this winter unless aid is given by the United States, declared the Rev. Samuel McCrae Cavert, one of the two general secretaries of the federal council of churches, at this morning's session of the annual meeting of the executive committee of that body. "Reports not only from German sources, but from American observers and churchmen indicate beyond anything yet imagined in this country," he said.

Announcement was made that the federal council of churches, in cooperation with the American Friends service committee and the various denominational agencies, will carry on a campaign in the churches to raise money for relief purposes in central Europe.
