CALIFORNIA FRUIT MEN MAKING NO MONEY THIS YEAR

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19.—Farm Loan Commissioner Cooper summarized conditions in various land bank districts today as follows:

Arizona, California, Nevada and Utah—Conditions as a whole are not so good as last year. The fruit men of California are making no profit and high freight rates are a heavy tax on agriculture. The cattle ranchmen of Arizona are still in a bad condition but the dairymen and poultry raisers have had a good year. Sugar beet growers have had a good crop with prospects of a fair price.

Idaho, Montana, Oregon and Washington—Agricultural conditions are better than last year. The wheat harvest was the largest in the history of the northwest and the production of livestock and fruit has set a record. Dairying and poultry raising are on the increase. The cost of transportation, however, consumed a large portion of the farmer's profit. The apple crop in Oregon and Idaho was large, but the prices are uncertain and the market unsatisfactory.

KLAN INSURGENTS IN OREGON FORM NEW ORGANIZATION

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 19.—An off-shoot of the Ku Klux Klan has been incorporated at Salem under the name of the Allied Protestant Americans. Back of the new A. P. A. society are insurgent klansmen, or rather klansmen who are insurgent against Fred L. Gifford, grand dragon of the realm of Oregon. Also in the new movement are members of the Lemon faction of the Loyal Orange lodge, who are opposing the Kirkland faction of the Ku Klux Klan.

The incorporators are Luther L. Powell, king kleele of the Klan, who has been denouncing Grand Dragon Gifford and whose contract to secure 50,000 new members for the Portland Klan was rescinded by the Klan a few weeks ago; Captain J. A. Pilz, and Harry A. Giddings, the latter secretary to Powell. The articles of incorporation state that the headquarters of the Allied Protestant Americans will be in Portland and that membership fees have been fixed at \$5.

The movement which brought about the creation of this new organization came after the recent attack made on Grand Dragon Gifford and which was followed by announcement that charges had been preferred against King Kleele Powell at Atlanta, Ga., and that Powell had been suspended from the privileges of the Klan pending his trial. Subsequently the king kleele received a telegram from Imperial Wizard Evans saying that Powell had not been banished.

POPE PIUS PREPARES CHRISTMAS MESSAGE ON RUHR SITUATION

ROME, Dec. 19.—(By Associated Press). Pope Pius has been negotiating with France and Germany with regard to his intention to insert in his allocution at tomorrow's secret consistory a message concerning the situation in Central Europe with special reference to the Ruhr question.

The pontiff does not wish to be misunderstood by either side and desires to pronounce a word of amity and Christmas peace and good will in order to bring about an understanding satisfactory to both parties.

According to reports received by the Vatican, German prisoners from the Ruhr are being detained along the Atlantic coast of France in discomforting conditions while a large number of the Germans compelled to leave the Ruhr region are scattered about other parts of Germany, unemployed and starving—a burden upon the remainder of the population and the government.

ENGLISH LIBERALS EXPECT TO FOLLOW LABOR GOVERNMENT

LONDON, Dec. 19.—Herbert Asquith's speech at the Liberal club, in which he said the party would form no alliance with other parties, is interpreted by the newspapers as meaning, in effect, that the liberals are determined to put a socialist government into power at the earliest possible moment after the preliminary business of the new parliament has been transacted, namely, about the third week in January.

The liberals plan to support a labor ministry as long as they judge it desirable to do so, the newspapers think, and will then turn it out and succeed to the administration themselves.

CHRISTMAS LIQUOR SEIZED AT S. F.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 19.—Two hundred cases of liquor were found by authorities to have been part of a \$75,000 cargo of a seagoing tug and intended for the holiday trade in San Francisco, were seized at a wharf here last night as it was being unloaded. The tug cast off its moorings and put to sea when the officers arrived, however, escaping capture. The tug brought the liquor from Canada, according to authorities.

JAPANESE CABINET WEATHERS STORM

TOKIO, Dec. 19.—(By Associated Press). A crisis which threatened possible dissolution of the Japanese cabinet has been passed and the campaign of the Seiyukai, majority political party of the diet, to force a reduction of more than 100,000,000 yen (\$50,000,000) in the government's estimates for earthquake reconstruction has met with success.

Facing dissolution or the necessity of resigning the cabinet decided to accept the curtailed reconstruction program.

Canada Wheat Exports.
OTTAWA, Dec. 19.—Canada exported nearly 9,000,000 more bushels of wheat in November, 1923, than in the same month a year ago, 64,196,000 bushels.

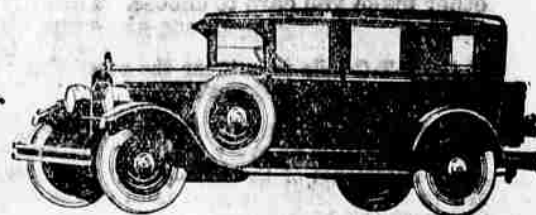
