PROFESSOR VINING SPEAKS AT FORUM WEDNESDAY NOON

Irving Vining, president of the Oregon State Chamber of Commerce will be the speaker at the Forum of the Medford Chamber of Commerce on Wednesday.

This forum will be more than of ordinary significance, following as it does Christmas Day. It will be held in the Craters' dining room at the Hotel Medford and special holiday decorations will be a feature. The price of the luncheon will be sixty cents and there will be one hundred plates.

The forum follows a conference of the secretaries of the Chambers of Commerce of Klamath Falls, Ashland, Grants Pass and Medford. Irving Vining, representing the State Chamber, will assist the secretaries to formulate a program of publicity for southern Oregon and will present the recommendations of the conference at the noon forum.

This will be the last forum in 1923 and is the 195th consecutive weekly forum which the Medford Chamber of Commerce has conducted.

LOS ANGELES LAWYER THIRD MAN SELECTED

PARIS, Dec. 24.—(By the Associated Press.)—Henry M. Robinson, lawyer and banker of Los Angeles, has been selected as the third American to serve on the expert committee which are to investigate the condition of Germany's finances under the auspices of the American reparations commission.

The two other Americans members previously selected are Charles G. Dawes, and Owen D. Young. Mr. Robinson, who is president of the First National bank of Los Angeles and prominently identified with other financial institutions was a member of the supreme economic council at the Paris peace conference in 1919. He also represented the United States at the first international labor conference.

He was created a chevalier of the legion of honor in 1920.

CANADIAN MAJOR ACCUSED OF CRIME

ST. LOUIS, Dec. 24.—Associate Magistrate Heath Jackson of Winnipeg, who also is a major in the 90th foot regiment of Canada, was arrested here today on telegraphic advices from Winnipeg which stated he was wanted to answer a charge of embezzling \$3415. He was traced to St. Louis, police said, through a letter he wrote Winnipeg officials under a different name, extolling Jackson as an upright man, and suggesting the embezzlement charge be dropped.

STOLEN ASHES OF JAP SOCIALIST TO BE RETURNED

TOKIO, Dec. 24.—(By Associated Press.) The ashes of the late Sakaye Otsugi, socialist leader, which were stolen from a room in which the urn was lying in state before funeral services on December 16, will be returned to the police tomorrow, the snatchers have informed authorities.

The theft was committed by three armed men who escaped in an automobile. The incident precipitated a situation which was considered critical for a time. Headquarters of the anti-socialist league having been closely guarded after socialists were said to have threatened reprisals for the desecration of the remains of their leader.

Otsugi was slain, with his wife and child, by Captain Amakasu, a gendarme officer, who declared he was actuated by patriotic motives. He is now serving a sentence of ten years imprisonment for the slaying.

PITY POOR ZBYSKO, WIFE ABUSES HIM

RIDDEFORD, Maine, Dec. 24.—Wladek Zbyzsko, wrestler, in asking for a divorce, charges that his wife, Amelia, has subjected him to cruel and abusive treatment. The case is on the trial list for the January term of the York county supreme court. Mrs. Zbyzsko is a little over five feet in height and of slight build.

IMPORTS EXCEED EXPORTS 1ST TIME IN U. S. HISTORY

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24.—Imports of agricultural products exceeded exports last year probably for the first time in history, the difference amounting to \$388,000,000, as compared with a \$174,000,000 excess in the value of exports over imports in the previous year.

The shift of the balance in trade in agricultural products in favor of foreign countries was attributed by the department of agriculture today chiefly to an increased value of imports and a decrease in the value of exports. Imports, including forest products, totaled \$2,315,000,000 last year, or 780,000,000 more than in the previous year, while exports aggregated \$1,927,000,000, a decrease of \$82,000,000.

Imports of silk were valued at \$14,000,000, sugar at \$69,000,000, coffee \$182,000,000, crude rubber \$169,000,000 and wool \$167,000,000. Wheat exports were valued at \$102,000,000, as compared with \$280,000,000 the preceding year, and corn \$75,000,000, compared with \$116,500,000.

U. S. ALIEN CUSTODIAN WELCOMES A PROBE

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24.—Thomas W. Miller, the alien property custodian, told President Coolidge today that his office would welcome any investigation congress may decide to make. A resolution to direct a senate inquiry into the administration of alien property has been introduced by Senator King, democrat, Utah.

"The alien property custodian's office stands ready for any inquiry now, as it ever has been," Miller said.

Mr. Miller also went over with the president his annual report which will be sent to congress the first of the year.

Sing Christmas Carols White House Tonight

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24.—All gates of the White House will be thrown open tonight while Christmas carols are sung at the north entrance.

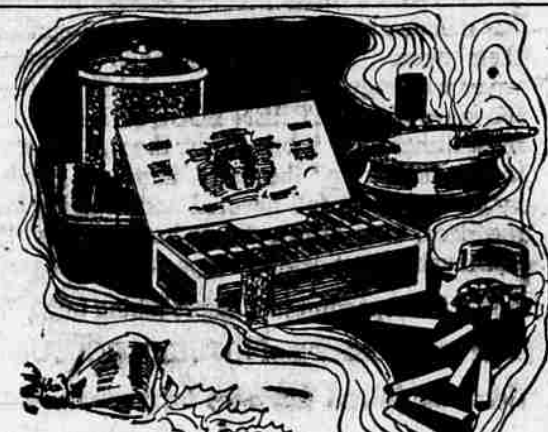
