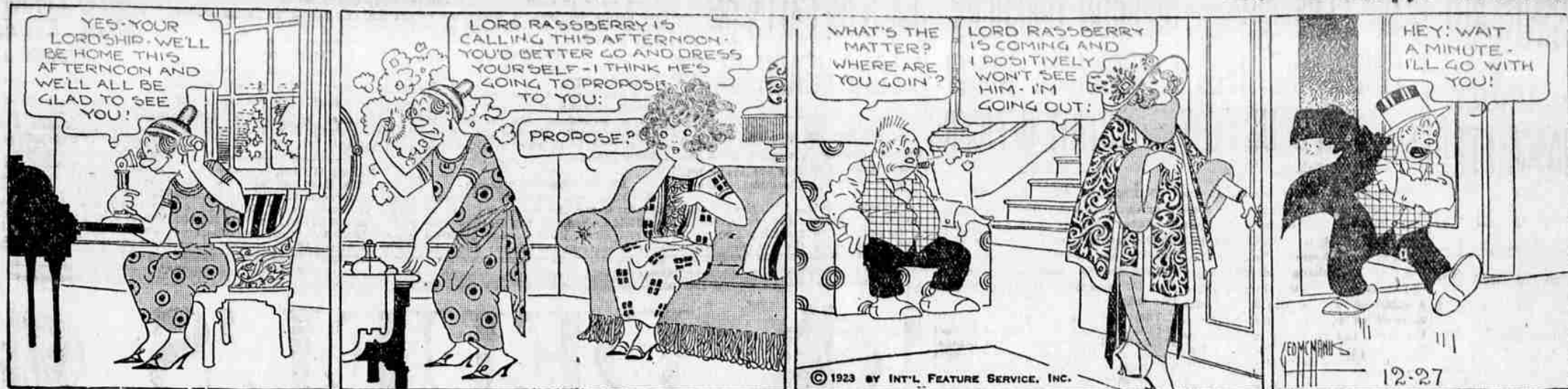

WOOD'S SYSTEM IS STUDIED BY WALL ST. VETS

NEW YORK, Dec. 27.—Market speculators who have grown grey at the task of trying to grow wealthy in Wall street today studied the system reputed to have made the fortune of Lieutenant Osborne C. Wood, son of Governor General Leonard Wood of the Philippines, who is reported to have accumulated between \$700,000 and \$800,000 by cable speculation from Manila to the street.

Commenting on the declaration yesterday of a financial "tipster" service head that Wood had acted as a night cab driver to him and for which he was said to have paid \$10,000 a month, including cable tolls, speculators said the young officer had demonstrated the truth of the theory that long range shots are the best.

Every day, it was declared by the "tipster," a cablegram analyzing the state of the stock market was sent to young Wood. In addition, special advice to buy or sell and answers to requests for information were sent all in plain English and not in code. Tolls ranged from a few dollars to \$50 a day. The last message from Wood was said to have been sent December 19, and it was believed it was on that day that Secretary of War Weeks directed that the young officer's operations should cease. Mr. Weeks said yesterday in Newton, Mass., that he had issued the order because he thought the "amounts involved appeared to be beyond the probable financial responsibilities of Wood." He added he did not think the subject warranted departmental action.

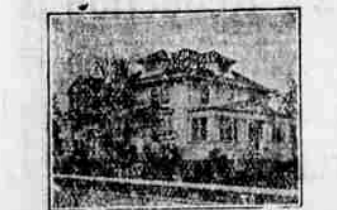

G. O. P. CONVENTION TO BE HELD IN NEW CITY AUDITORIUM

CLEVELAND, Ohio, Dec. 27.—In Cleveland's new \$6,500,000 municipal auditorium, scene of the republican national convention of 1924, Ohio political leaders are confident that the general facilities are entirely adequate to meet the situation and that the building will be found a worthy background in the naming of the party's presidential nominee.

Hotel accommodations and other space necessary in handling a national convention likewise are declared sufficient while the various civic organizations and commercial institutions of the city have no doubt about the raising of a huge chest fund to carry on the enterprise. Mayor Fred Kohler offered the use of the auditorium free of charge to either major party's national convention. It was Cleveland's first bid for a national convention of the two big parties.

Situated in the heart of the downtown section, the new public hall is said to present all that could be desired for a large convention. It is a part of Cleveland's famous Mall plan of buildings, occupying a block.
