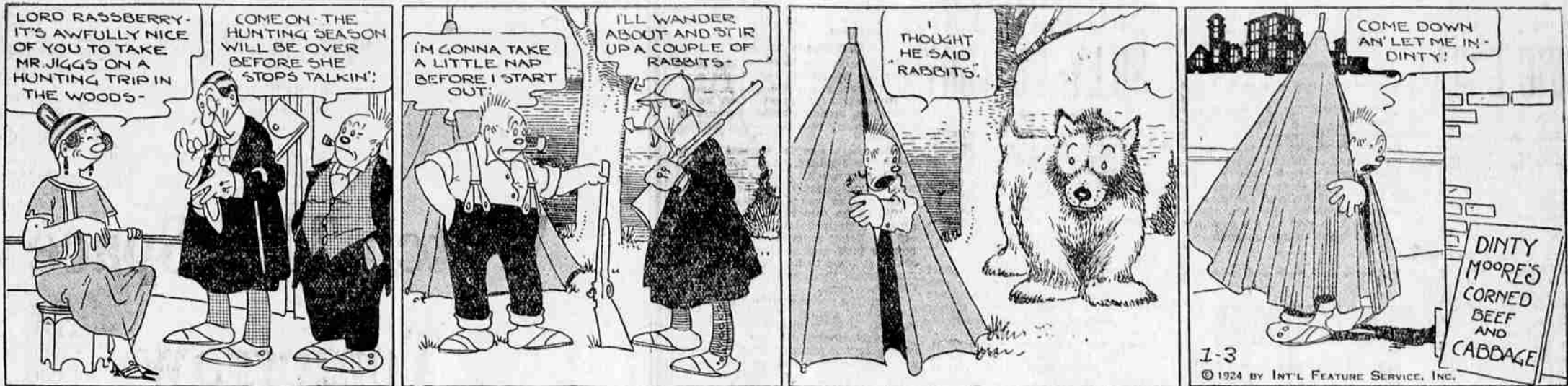

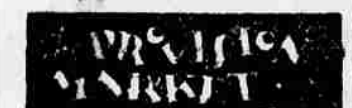
HIRAM TO TEAR OFF LID IN HIS SPEECH TONIGHT

CLEVELAND, O., Jan. 3.—(By the Associated Press)—Senator Hiram Johnson of California arrived here today in a fighting humor and will open his campaign for the republican nomination for president tonight with a discussion of a variety of issues.

"I am in this race and will fight it out to the best of my ability and endurance," said the senator upon his arrival from Washington. "The fight has just begun. It has taken two supreme court decisions to get my name before the people of Alabama. I think I am on the ballot in Alabama, but I am not sure yet. Now I hear that a committee has tried to turn this state over to my opponents. Let me tell you that no man or no committee of men can deliver up the vote of a great state like this to any candidate. I care not how influential they are, nor how rich they might be. All that I ask is that the people be allowed to select their choice."

CLEVELAND, Jan. 3.—The first gun in his battle to wrest Ohio from the "orthodox republicans" and President Coolidge will be fired here tonight by Senator Hiram W. Johnson in an address at Masonic temple. Forcing issue, his friends say, will have only a minor part in the speech. "He's going to tear off the lid," according to his secretary, Roy A. Burr, who arrived here yesterday to make preliminary arrangements for Mr. Johnson's visit. "We realize we have a very hard fight in Ohio, but we are used to hard fighting."

Plans were made by State Senator George H. Bender, his Cleveland manager; John D. Packler, chairman of the Cleveland executive committee and other supporters, to meet Mr. Johnson on his arrival from Washington. Frank H. Hitchcock, the senator's national campaign manager, was due to reach Cleveland from New York today.
