### O. A. C. BASKETBALL QUINTET DEFEATS FRESNO 39 TO 25

FRESNO, Cal., Jan. 5.—The Oregon Agricultural college basketball team easily defeated the State College of Fresno quintet 39 to 25 here last night. Clever passing was chiefly responsible for the Aggies' victory. Gill and Hiddings starred for Oregon, Baxter and Telonicher for Fresno.

MARSEILLES, Jan. 5.—Erniolo Spalla, champion heavyweight boxer of Europe, plans to sail January 10 for Buenos Aires, there to meet Luis Angel Firpo in a bout in February. Spalla told the correspondent today that he was in excellent shape, having been in constant training since December 1.

Spalla said he had signed articles for a bout with Georges Carpentier in April. He thought Carpentier also would sign. In any case, he added, the winner of the bout in Buenos Aires would challenge Jack Dempsey for the championship title.

**Leonard to Meet Silver.**  
SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 5.—Jack Silver, local lightweight, will meet Benny Leonard, lightweight champion, in a four round exhibition bout at the Olympic club here next Tuesday at noon.

Silver, a former newsboy, has been a consistent winner here, and his showing against Pete Daley, in a draw bout here last night, earned Leonard's consent to meet him in an exhibition match.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 5.—Joe Kirkwood, California open golf champion, and MacDonald Smith will meet Jack Neville and Johnny McHugh on the Lincoln park course here today in a best ball foursome.

NEW YORK, Jan. 5.—Pal Moran, New Orleans lightweight, moved another step closer to his goal—a match for Benny Leonard's world title—by defeating Johnny Shugrue of Waterbury, Conn., in less than five rounds last night in Madison Square Garden.

Moran punished the game Waterbury star so severely that the referee stopped the contest in the fifth round to save Shugrue from further punishment. Moran thus won the match technically.

## JEWEL 'TIPSTER' GETS \$37,500 FOR ARREST

NEW YORK, Jan. 5.—Greater activity on the part of "tipsters" who inform treasury department officials of gem purchases by wealthy Americans abroad today was expected to result from the announcement yesterday that co-operation between a "tipster" government agents and the American Jewellers' Protective association led to the payment by Simon W. Straus, investment broker, of \$350,000 in duty and penalty for failure to declare jewelry brought from Europe last November. Of this amount the person who supplied the information will receive \$37,500, or 25 per cent.

Shoots at Temple, Hits Eye.  
SANTA MONICA, Cal., Jan. 5.—E. H. Todd, 40, was recovering today from what police said was an attempted suicide. Todd, they said, fired a bullet at his temple, but instead of piercing his skull it glanced around under the skin, pierced his right eye and emerged from his nose.

## LINCOLN LETTERS TO GIDEON WELLS SELL FOR \$1250

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 5.—Two letters written by Abraham Lincoln to his secretary of navy, Gideon Wells, brought \$1250 each here yesterday at a public auction of Civil war documents. In one of the letters, relating to the gunboat Monitor, Lincoln said that he was "decidedly of the opinion that she should not go sky-larking up to Norfolk," for, he wrote, Lieutenant Worden had told him the Monitor could be easily boarded and captured.

In the other letter, dated August 23, 1864, President Lincoln said that if he would be defeated for reelection by McClellan. A letter in which he asked for a "war steamer" to cruise the Potomac and protect the approaches to Washington brought \$470.
