EUROPE IS SWEEPED BY HARD STORMS, VILLAGES BURNED

LONDON, Jan. 10.—Unusually severe storms, accompanied by intense snow, is sweeping Europe. Off the coasts of Spain and France the disturbances have proved a serious menace to shipping while in the North Sea and Scandinavian waters the ice floes are so heavy that navigation in many places is difficult.

Not in many years have there been so many casualties from avalanches in the Swiss and French Alps.

BERGAMO, Italy, Jan. 10.—Some villages in the province of Bergamo are reported buried as a result of heavy storms.

ANCONA, Italy, Jan. 10.—In consequence of the torrential rains many houses in the village of Mondolfo are becoming unsafe, while frequent earth shocks add to the distress of the population and increase the damage to property.

PARIS, Jan. 10.—The tidal wave that ravaged the Atlantic coast of France yesterday is believed to have been of volcanic origin, since it was accompanied in many places by a slight earthquake.

MADRID, Jan. 10.—Severe storms are raging off the northwest coast. The loss of an unnamed steamer with her crew of nine men is reported from San Sebastian.

DENY KU KLUX BEHIND SCHOOL BILL, WASHINGTON

TACOMA, Jan. 10.—That the five Tacoma men who presented an initiative measure designed to require attendance of all children of grammar school age at the public schools of the state and which would in effect prohibit parochial and private schools for such children are the same five who had filed on December 29, 1923, articles of incorporation for the "Washington Good Government League," is disclosed by the records at Olympia.

Palley Stickler, insurance agent, one of the sponsors of the measure, stated today that so far as he knows the Ku Klux Klan has nothing to do with the proposed initiative measure aimed at private schools.

"The bill has the active backing of the Good Government League of Washington and is not directed against any church," he said, "it is designed to uphold public schools rather than to attack private schools."

INVESTIGATE INCENDIARY FIRES AT ASTORIA, OREGON
