WEMME WILL CASE
IS ORDERED BACK
BY SUPREME COURT

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 12.—The supreme court yesterday handed down the following opinions:

W. P. Coates vs. Alvin Slusher, appellant; appeal from Umatilla county; suit for damages because of alleged alienation of wife's affections; opinion by Justice Harris; Judge G. W. Phelps affirmed.

New mandate ordered in E. Henry Wemme estate case of Portland, nullifying appointment of trustees by Judge George Tazewell and sending case back to Judge H. H. Belt for appointment of trustees and final disposition; order limits attorney's fees to a total of \$15,000, refusing to allow about \$150,000 in fees demanded by attorneys; motion for re-opening case is overruled.

State of Oregon ex rel school district No. 6, Umatilla county, appellants, vs. Jesse Goff et al; appeal from Umatilla county; controversy over legality of organization of school district; opinion by Justice Burnett. Judge Fred W. Wilson reversed.

James C. Ford, appellant, vs. J. P. Schall, appeal from Malheur county; suit to recover money. Opinion by Justice Brown. Judge Dalton Biggs reversed.

Homer I. Watts, appellant, vs. George Gerking, et al, appeal from Umatilla county; action for malicious prosecution, opinion by Justice Brand. Judge Gilbert W. Phelps reversed and case remanded.

Lum Sing, appellant, vs. Joseph Gribbler, appeal from Clatsop county; suit for damages because of eviction of tenant from property. Opinion by Justice Burnett. Judge J. A. Eakin reversed and case remanded.

Victor Phelps, appellant, vs. Frank L. Stanciliff, appeal from Douglas county; action in ejectment. Opinion by Justice McCourt. Judge J. W. Hamilton reversed and case remanded.

J. K. Bell vs. Fred Spain, et al, appellants, appeal from Union county; suit to recover on note. Opinion by Justice Bean. Judge J. W. Knowles affirmed.

Bank of Jordan Valley, appellant, vs. John A. Oliver, appeal from Malheur county; suit to recover money on promissory note. Opinion by Chief Justice McBride. Judge Dalton Briggs reversed and case remanded.

About fifteen dealers in butter and eggs will start as charter members.

NAVY POLAR FLIGHT
AROUSES CONGRESS

WASHINGTON, Jan. 15.—The navy department would be required, under a resolution introduced by Representative Taylor, democrat, West Virginia, to inform the house what scientific facts could be ascertained by the proposed flight of the dirigible Shenandoah to the North pole.

The resolution asks information as to the number of officers and enlisted men who will make the flight and whether defects in the French dirigible Dixmude and the American airship ZR-2, destroyed with loss of life, have been corrected in the Shenandoah.

Information also is requested as to the cost of the polar flight.
