DEM. COMMITTEE IS IN FAVOR OF WM. G. M'ADOO

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16.—A novelty in more than half a century of American politics—a national convention in New York City—is to be presented in the 1924 campaign.

Historic Madison Square Garden in New York City will be the scene of this year's democratic national convention. The convention will open June 24, probably a week after the republican convention at Cleveland ends.

Not since 1868, a lapse of 56 years, has New York had a national political gathering. It wins the democratic clasp this year by dint of many efforts and a contribution aggregating \$205,000 to the democratic national committee. An equal sum was offered by San Francisco but the committee voted against repeating its 1920 trek to the Pacific coast.

The final vote giving the convention to New York after Chicago had been withdrawn was: New York 57; San Francisco 40 and St. Louis 6.

The choice later was made unanimous.

Sharp bidding preceded the committee's action, the tide swinging to New York when its delegation flung in an additional check for \$55,000 besides its initial bid of \$150,000. The total breaks all financial records in political convention competition and also enables the democratic committee to start the 1924 campaign with a handy balance after wiping out the deficit of about \$180,000 from the 1920 campaign.

New York's civic committee and a convention arrangements committee, headed by Chairman Hull will start work immediately in preparation for the June meeting.

The committee had a final session today to complete routine business, including the formal convention call and action on a resolution sponsored by Senator Glass of Virginia, designed to increase the number of women in the convention by adding to the number of delegates at large but reducing their ballots to a half vote each, so as to leave the present actual voting strength unchanged.

At the conclusion of the committee's work, members had an engagement to attend an informal reception at the home of former President Wilson.

Electoneering in the interests of the various declared and potential presidential candidates continued today among the committee members. The McAdoo camp made public a poll, taken by a member of the McAdoo publicity forces, showing that 52 men and women on the national committee out of 91 polled, favored McAdoo's nomination with 25 non-committal and others scattered.

BILLY MISKE BENEFIT BRINGS WIDOW \$11,000

ST. PAUL, Minn., Jan. 15.—(By the Associated Press)—Billy Miske's greatest desire—to have his family well provided for—was fulfilled here last night when nearly \$11,000 was raised at a testimonial boxing program for the benefit of the late heavy-weight pugilist's widow and three children.

The ticket receipts totalled \$9220. This was increased \$1309 through donations and the sale of a baseball autographed by Babe Ruth, home run king. Harry Heilmann, champion batsman of the American league, auctioned off the baseball which brought \$500. Champion Jack Dempsey's check for \$500 was included in the donations.
