

Macaroni At It's Best

FALL IN FLORIDA, ANSWERS CRITICS, OUT OF POLITICS

NEW ORLEANS, Jan. 18.—Albert D. Fall, former secretary of the interior, who is spending a few days in New Orleans, having arrived here Wednesday from Florida, stated he was through with politics.

"I'm out of politics," the former secretary declared. "I'm going to spend the rest of my life traveling around. I hope to take that ocean voyage soon."

Mr. Fall yesterday replied briefly to an attack in the United States senate Wednesday by Senator Caraway of Arkansas denying charges of the senator that he had received any compensations from the Sinclair oil interests in connection with the leasing of the Teapot Dome reserve or that he had registered at a hotel in Palm Beach, Fla., under a different name during the congressional investigation of the oil lease.

"The investigating committee has been on the job for many months and has not produced a shred of evidence," Mr. Fall said. "Even the innuendo witnesses are breaking down. One of them, for instance, testified that I had at one time told him I was broke and a few years later bought a large ranch in Mexico. He admitted being a bitter political enemy of mine."

ROPE BREAKS, BUT HANGING A SUCCESS, UTAH SLAYER PAYS

FORT MADISON, Iowa, Jan. 18.—(By the Associated Press.)—Roy Maupin, negro, was hanged at 7:20 a. m. today for the murder of Joe Hayes, Carney, Iowa, miner. As the trap was sprung and Maupin dropped to his death, the rope which suspended him, broke midway between the noose and the knot which fastened it to the gallows and the body fell to the ground.

Warden T. P. Hollowell ordered the prison physicians to apply their stethoscopes at once and they found that Maupin's neck was broken by the fall. He was pronounced dead at 7:41, fifteen minutes after the trap was sprung. Physicians said the breaking of the rope had no effect upon Maupin, and pointed out that death occurred in approximately the same time as at all of the executions at the prison in the last eighteen months.

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, Jan. 18.—Omer R. Woods, convicted wife murderer, was executed by a firing squad at the Utah state prison here at 8:17 o'clock this morning. He met death calmly and protested his innocence to the end. The killing of Mrs. Woods occurred in an apartment house here January 9, 1923.

TUT'S TOMB SHOWS EGYPTIAN GENERAL STOLE HIS GLORY

LUXOR, Egypt, Jan. 18.—(By the Associated Press.)—Was Tutankhamun ever a full fledged king?

This question daily becomes more acute as the examination of the pharaoh's sepulchre proceeds. From the first, the archaeologists have been puzzled by the scantiness both in dimension and decoration, of the tomb of this pharaoh, who nevertheless was laid to rest in such state.

Nor has it escaped their notice that in this respect the tomb of Tutankhamun resembles that of Akhenaten his predecessor and of Ay, his successor, whereas the burial places of Amenhotep III, Akhenaten's predecessor, and of Haremhab, Ay's successor, are of full royal type with spacious chambers splendidly decorated.

Haremhab, a general, was Tutankhamun's commander in chief and is said to have reigned for 59 years, but this can only be sustained by reckoning in with his reign those of several of his predecessors. The freedom with which the general usurped the fame of Tutankhamun by obliterating his cartouches in many places, both in the Luxor temples and elsewhere, certainly suggests that he was unwilling to allow Tutankhamun full credit for his reign.

PARENTS TO SUFFER FOR LETTING KIDS ROAM THE STREETS

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 18.—Parents of children under eighteen who are allowed to roam the streets after nine o'clock at night are to be arrested and prosecuted under charges of contributing to the delinquency of minors, it was decided at a conference of all juvenile law enforcement officers today.

The second step in curbing juvenile crime and delinquency will be the arrest of pool hall owners, motion picture theater owners, dance hall owners, etc., who allow children under eighteen to frequent their places after the nine o'clock curfew hour, it was announced.

Store owners who sell cigarettes to minors will be henceforth charged with contributing to the delinquency of those minors, instead of the city charge of selling cigarettes to minors.

OREGON WILD LIFE FILMS COMING

Residents of Medford will be given an extraordinary treat next Wednesday night, for arrangements are being made for a large hall where all the citizens are to be invited to hear free of cost an illustrated lecture and to see motion picture films of wild animals and birds of Western Oregon by Professor W. L. Finley, a talk on the beauty spots in Oregon, illustrated with stereopticon slides by R. W. Price, vice-president of Crater Lake National Park Co., and an interesting talk on tourists by James A. Ormandy, general passenger agent of the Southern Pacific.

A special invitation is being extended to high school students and the pupils of the seventh and eighth grades.

Further details of this event will be announced at the beginning of next week.

Raw Fur Prices Highest of Season

Prices of all raw furs are now the highest of the season and the demand is exceptionally strong according to a report received from A. B. Shubert, Inc., of Chicago, Ill., the largest house in the world dealing exclusively in American raw furs, whose ad appears elsewhere in this paper.

The trapper who gets busy at once and collects the furs will realize big money for his catch. The season is at its height now—furs are at their best and will grade up—and prices are at the peak. "Not in many years have we had a stronger demand," says Shubert.

The fur catch to date is far below normal and this condition is responsible for prices being pushed up so high. There is a shortage of all furs. This shortage was caused by restricted trapping in most states.

Shubert is also offering \$50 in cash every day during the fur season for the three best handled shipments of furs received. The first prize is \$25; second \$15; and third \$10. The purpose of the contest is to stimulate interest in the proper handling of raw furs.

PARIS, Jan. 18.—(By the Associated Press.)—Dr. Schacht, president of the reichsbank and currency commission who has accepted the invitation of the reparation experts to come here for consultation in connection with an inquiry into Germany's finances is expected to arrive Sunday. The technical advisers attached to the expert committee continued today their study of the documents concerning the German note circulation and general finances in preparation for drawing up a questionnaire for General Schacht.

SPEEDER HITS TRUCK 3 HURT, ONE NEAR DEATH, FIND BOTTLE

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 18.—Russell Beckett of this city is hovering between life and death in a local hospital with a fractured skull, and Harry Rich and Walter Klein, also of Salem, are nursing painful bruises and cuts as a result of a collision of the automobile in which they were returning from Portland with a truck on the Pacific highway about seven miles north of here at two o'clock this morning.

An unidentified fourth party in the automobile, whose name has been reported both as Miles and Niles, suffered slight injuries.

Deputy Sheriff Bert Smith, who investigated the accident, this morning turned over to local chemists a bottle which he picked up at the scene of the wreck and asked that the contents be analyzed to determine whether or not it contained intoxicants.
