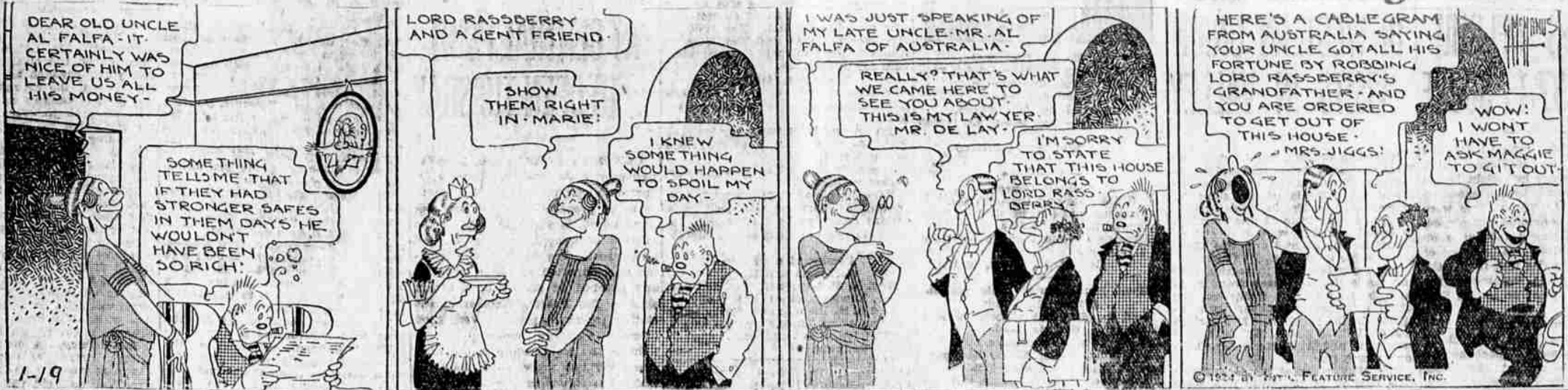

HARRY GREB GIVES JOHNNY WILSON A TERRIFIC BEATING

NEW YORK, Jan. 19.—Harry Greb, of Pittsburg, gave Johnny Wilson of Boston, one of the typical Greb mailings in their fifteen round contest at Madison Square Garden last night.

Wilson, former middleweight titleholder, lost the crown to Greb last summer at the Polo grounds and he was essaying to recapture it. But Greb, whom the boxing gossips had been speaking of as a "has been" displayed the finest points of his ability, led the fighting throughout the fifteen rounds and won decisively. The judges were unanimous in their opinion that Greb had won.

Try Out Golf Balls
BRUNSWICK, Ga., Jan. 19.—Thirty-five amateur golfers today drove, putted, pitched and chipped golf balls ranging in weight from 1.52 ounces to 1.62 ounces, the weight of the present standardized ball, and varying in size from balls considerably smaller to somewhat larger than the present ball, in an effort to determine the standard ball of the future. The golf ball experiments are being conducted on Kelli Island, about eighteen miles from here.

The experiment has the approval of the United States Golf association and British golf authorities. According to C. S. Lee, secretary of the United States Golf association the series of experiments is to test action of golf balls of various weights and sizes under varying conditions.

THY WRESTLES TO DRAW WITH DERN
