HOPPE SMOTHERS SCHAEFER; NOW LEADS BY 261

CHICAGO, Jan. 23.—Willie Hoppe, of New York has a fine chance to retain his world's title in 1924 billiards tonight when, returning play in the final 500 point block of his 1500 point match with Young Jake Schaefer, he will find the balls in excellent scoring position at the head of the table to add to his lead of 1000 to 739.

Facing a deficit of 131 points last night as a result of losing the first block, 369 to 500, Hoppe took full advantage of Schaefer's inability to score consistently by putting together runs of 182 and 172 and taking the block 361 to 239.

Excepting for the two impressive innings, however, Hoppe flourished as badly as did Schaefer and that was enough to bring groans from the spectators.

Both men were inclined to blame their poor playing on the billiard balls, in the night's fifth inning obtaining a change, but the ivory expert for the company supplying the balls insisted they were as nearly perfect as possible for them to be.

The experts struggled through 21 innings last night, Hoppe averaging 23 1/2 and Schaefer doing no better than 11 1/2.

Schaefer's first seven innings netted him only 24 points while Hoppe was getting but 59. Schaefer picked up a 70 and 50 in his eighth and ninth innings, but faded virtually to nothing for the remaining nineteen innings when he averaged only seven and a fraction.

Part of the poor scoring was due to the extreme safety play the men resorted to, one fan being heard to remark after the match "200 points of billiards and 500 of safety."

The final block, with Schaefer needing 761 before Hoppe can count 500 will be played tonight at eight o'clock, central standard time.

JOE STECHER WINS, NOW AFTER LEWIS

ST. LOUIS, Mo., Jan. 23.—Having gained a victory over the veteran Polish wrestler, Stanislaus Zbyzsko here last night, Joe Stecher, Nebraska heavyweight wrestler, today was awaiting arrangements for a finish bout with Ed (Strangler) Lewis, world's heavyweight champion wrestler. On the condition that he be given a chance at Lewis' crown, Stecher, it was reported here, guaranteed Zbyzsko a purse of \$10,000 which was paid to the former champion prior to last night's bout.

GOVERNOR PINCHOT NOT TO BE A CANDIDATE

HARRISBURG, Pa., Jan. 23.—Reports that Governor Pinchot would be a candidate for president this year were disposed of by Speaker Jay C. Goodnow of the state house of representatives, after a conference with the governor today by the statement that "for some time it has been known among the governor's friends that he would not be a formal candidate for president and would not ask for instructed delegates from Pennsylvania."
