

AUTO CONGESTION RESPONSIBLE FOR JAPAN DISASTER

WASHINGTON, Jan. 25.—Belief that continued study of seismological data will enable scientists to send warnings of earthquakes and volcanic eruptions in time to save lives, and to some extent protect property, was expressed today by Dr. Thomas A. Jagger, Jr., director of the government's Hawaiian volcano observatory.

Dr. Jagger has been in Japan conferring with scientists in regard to the earthquake disaster there in September on which he is preparing a comprehensive report for the government. The effects of the automobile congestion in Tokyo and Yokohama at the time of the earthquake, Dr. Jagger said in a statement today, profoundly impressed him. The cars became so jammed in the narrow streets that fire apparatus could not get through.

"It was this condition as much as the earthquake itself which made the Japanese disaster the biggest of all similar horrors on record," said Dr. Jagger. "I consider it only a question of time, when due to the increasing problem of automobile traffic, all large cities will provide special parking areas or buildings for automobiles and never allow any machines to stand in the streets without a driver at the wheel."

"While it is true that on the Atlantic seaboard the likelihood of an earthquake and resulting fire is fairly remote, this is not true in Pacific cities, which are in a recognized earthquake district. Yet the population of such cities as Los Angeles and Seattle continue to increase, and continue heedlessly to block up arteries of traffic by allowing such potential causes of fire as parked automobiles to stand about in the busiest streets."

MINE REDS RENEW ATTACK ON LEWIS

INDIANAPOLIS, Jan. 24.—(By the Associated Press)—Insurgents within the ranks of the United Mine Workers of America renewed their attacks on President John L. Lewis, when the biennial convention was reconvened today and the credentials committee reported in favor of unseating Joseph Chiccolini of local union 5216 in the coke field district No. 4 (Pennsylvania). The charge was made before the committee by William Foeney, secretary-treasurer of the district, that Chiccolini is an officer in a "dual organization—the progressive mine workers."

Ald considerable confusion three standing votes were taken on the committee's report to unseat Chiccolini and after the third, President Lewis declared the report adopted, 866 to 399.

Opponents of the administration renewed their cry of yesterday of "rail-roading," "steamroller," and "gag rule."

RATE HEARING IN PORTLAND CLOSES

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 24.—Cumulative testimony was offered at this morning's session of the hearing before M. A. Pattison, examiner of the Interstate Commerce commission that as an economical necessity the transcontinental railroads should be permitted to publish westbound rates on various commodities from the Chicago territory to Pacific coast terminals, without corresponding reductions to interior cities, to enable carrier competition with steamship lines via the Panama canal. The hearing in Portland will be concluded this afternoon with testimony on behalf of LaGrande and Baker chambers of commerce.

RECOGNITION OF RUSSIA BY JOHN BULL IMMINENT

LONDON, Jan. 25.—(By the Associated Press)—Prime Minister MacDonald's recent denunciation of the "pomposity" of withholding full recognition of Soviet Russia has prepared everybody for early action by the new government in that direction and it is stated unofficially that James O'Grady, M. P., is already being considered for the position of British ambassador to Moscow. Mr. O'Grady who holds one of the Leeds seats in the house of commons, has made a study of Russian affairs. He visited Moscow officially in 1917 and again in 1922 in connection with the trade union famine relief movement. The new prime minister's interest in the League of Nations is well known, and, according to the Daily Telegraph, he contemplates an expansion of the league section of the foreign office in order to use it to the utmost as an instrument of general pacification. For this reason, according to the newspaper, Mr. MacDonald means to devote every effort toward the early inclusion of Germany and Russia in the league.

NEW RUM TREATY WITH G. B. SIGNED

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24.—The new rum treaty with Great Britain was signed yesterday at the state department.

Secretary Hughes for the United States and Sir Auckland Geddes, the retiring British ambassador, affixed their signatures to the agreement which provides for extension of the American search beyond the three-mile limit and permits British vessels to bring ship stores into American ports under seal. Senate ratification is required before the new arrangement becomes effective but there are indications that pending that formal approval the two governments tacitly will follow a lenient policy toward each other in dealing with the liquor question—until now one of the most serious to disturb British-American relations in recent years.

FORD TO INCREASE OUTPUT IN 1924

DETROIT, Jan. 25.—The Ford Motor company made 2,250,652 automobiles, trucks and tractors in 1923, which is 775,059 more than in any previous year according to production figures, announced today. Of the total 1,815,485 automobiles and trucks were made in this country, and 175,474 in foreign plants, including Canada. To the total of these are added 101,898 tractors and 7,825 Lincoln cars. The figures were coupled with an announcement that the Ford company expects to exceed this figure in its 1924 production, and that it plans to start early this spring on its program of 10,000 cars daily.

Four Ship Has Foundered
MARSSEILLE, France, Jan. 25.—The cargo steamer *Montrose* which left Oran, Algeria for Dunkirk, on January 3, is believed to have foundered in the recent tidal wave off the Atlantic coast. The *Montrose* carried four officers, three engineers, a wireless officer, a steward and a crew of forty-one.
