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HOOVER TO AID
IN RELIEF FOR
COUNTRY BANKS

WASHINGTON, Jan. 25.—Administration officials are working on a plan for the formation of a syndicate of metropolitan bankers in middle western cities, who, it is hoped, may underwrite sufficient loans to relieve the northwestern bankers in the present credit stringency.

Comptroller of the Currency Dawes, head of the special mission sent out last week by President Coolidge to study the credit situation, returned to the treasury today and immediately went into conference with Secretary Mellon. He declined to discuss plans which it was said the delegation had formulated but which have not been finally approved.

Secretaries Hoover and Wallace, working at the direction of President Coolidge arranged today to call to Washington for conferences, representatives of various interests in the middle and northwest holding securities of northwestern farmers. The purpose of the conferences were to arrange a refunding of loans now past due as a means of affording relief.

SIoux FALLS, S. D., Jan. 25.—Buoyed by the announcement that the war finance corporation would establish an agency here, South Dakota bankers and state officials today viewed with increased optimism the situation growing out of the recent closing of several banks.

Bank examiners are continuing their investigation of the other two local banks recently closed and directors of two institutions declared they were working on general plans of reorganization.

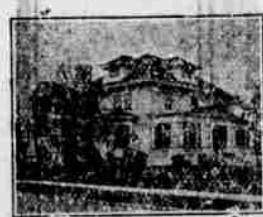

URGES ADOPTION
MELLON PLAN OF
TAX REDUCTION

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24.—Secretary Mellon's program for tax reduction was defended today in the house by Representative Mills of New York, a republican member of the ways and means committee which is engaged in framing a revenue bill.

Mr. Mills argued vigorously for the reduction in sur-tax rates to a maximum of 25 per cent as recommended by Mr. Mellon and attacked the democratic plan to cut surtaxes only to a maximum of 44 per cent while further reducing normal income rates, as "limiting the benefits of tax reduction to 3,000,000 individuals."

The Mellon plan proposes relief for the small income tax payers. Mr. Mills explained, "that also reduction of surtaxes on higher incomes, not for the benefit of the few individuals who pay them, but because from the standpoint of the welfare and prosperity of all of our people to retain them is uneconomic and harmful."
