STRANGE CASE OF NON-SUPPORT IS AIRED IN COURT

An odd case was on hearing in Justice Taylor's court yesterday in which Frank J. Court, about 30 years old, and an ex-service man who is drawing \$100 a month pension and government insurance of \$57 a month, because of total disability, having been gassed and wounded in France, was the defendant on a non-support charge made by his 18 year old wife. They are from the Sams valley section, and both were in attendance at the hearing.

Court is suffering from a bad case of diabetes and claims also to be tubercular. They have spent much of the time for a year or more past in camping out. It seems that the couple for months past have not got on very agreeably, and the young wife testified that some time ago he told her that he did not want her around any more. He said she did not take good care of the camp. She then went to live with her parents and has been with them since some time in October and he has been living with his parents.

In all this time both admit that Court had given her only \$10 for her support. She consulted Gus Newbury as her attorney about this time, and he and T. W. Miles, who is Court's attorney in the matter, got together with the dissatisfied couple, as a result of which Court promised to pay her \$25 a month out of his \$157 monthly received from the government pension and insurance, beginning with next February. The young wife, however, insisted that she should have at least \$25 a month to get along with, but finally agreed to take the lesser sum.

Then recently, hearing that Court was making arrangements to at once enter a government hospital in California for treatment, she brought the non-support proceedings. Sheriff Terrell went out to Sams Valley the other day and served the warrant on him, but did not bring him back as prisoner, as Court promised to deliver himself in court.

Justice Taylor, at the conclusion of yesterday's hearing, continued the case until January 29, in hopes that the estranged couple and their attorneys could reach a satisfactory financial settlement in the meantime.

FOOTBALL COACH AT O. A. C. RESIGNS

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 25.—R. B. Rutherford, football coach and athletic director at Oregon Agricultural college since 1920, announced last night he had resigned to become effective of the present school year. Lack of co-operation of alumni of the college and the active opposition of some of them had much to do with his resignation, he said.

WHERE COUNTY HAS SPENT ROAD MONEY LAST THREE YEARS

Jackson county has expended on the Medford-Jacksonville road, in the last three years, according to figures furnished by the county clerk's office, \$28,646.87. Most of this was for maintenance. In 1923 close to \$10,000 was spent, the exact figures not being available. The bill for maintenance in 1923 was \$7182.92, lesser items totaling in the neighborhood of \$3000.

From Jacksonville to the Josephine county line \$120,167.81 was expended in the last three years, approximately \$40,000 being used on the Ruch-Jacksonville section.

In the same period \$140,265.03 was spent on the Butte Falls road, \$53,684.16 on the Sams Valley section; \$50,405.83 in the Evans Creek district and \$218,560.33 on the Crater Lake Highway.

ANN ARBOR, Mich., Jan. 25.—"Professor Fielding H. Yost" is the way Michigan's veteran football mentor may get his mail hereafter. The board of regents of the university have made "Hurry Up" a professor of the theory and practice of athletic coaching. The action gives the director of athletics full academic rank on the campus.

Higher Ups in Ohio Whiskey Ring Start Penitentiary Terms

CINCINNATI, Jan. 25.—Traveling in a special car attached to a Southern railway train, George Remum, Cincinnati attorney, and twelve men associated with him in an alleged "whiskey ring" are to arrive in Atlanta today to begin sentences after conviction on charges of having conspired to violate the Volstead act.

Remum was sentenced to two years in the federal prison and one year in jail and fined \$11,000. The other prisoners were given sentences ranging from one year to eighteen months at Atlanta and lesser jail terms.

Phila. Police Chief Threatens to Clean Up His Own Police Force

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 25.—The third 84-hour police drive against vice and crime here started today under the direction of General Smedley D. Butler, director of public safety. The police swung into action after the director had held a conference with high officials of the department. Preceding the conference forty-two lieutenants were summoned to his office. "Hundreds of joints," he said, "supposedly closed have been operating openly in daylight and this is going to be stopped at once. I told the lieutenants if they couldn't do what I wanted, the police force would be too hot a place for them."
