Medford pears and catsup will be the two products of this community that will be served at the Oregon products dinner at the Hotel LaSalle at Chicago in the early part of March.

This dinner will be given to the advertising managers of the largest railroads in the United States and will be in charge of A. S. Dudley of the Oregon State Chamber of Commerce. The object is to sell Oregon to these railroad men and give them a better understanding of the opportunities here for the settler.

Nothing but Oregon grown products will be served at the dinner and guests will receive many favors such as myrtle wood ash trays, miniature blankets and the like. The directors of the Medford Chamber of Commerce will furnish canned pears and small bottles of Rogue River Valley catsup. Motion pictures of industries and scenic attractions will be provided for after dinner entertainment and it is anticipated that Oregon will be known to these advertising men far better than ever before.

ENGLISH CHAMPION DEFEATED BY TED THYE IN PORTLAND

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 31.—Ted Thye, Portland light-heavyweight wrestler, defeated Sam Clapham, the English champion, in a two-hour match here last night. There was only one fall, and that went to Thye at the end of one hour and 44 minutes with a reverse hammerlock.

CHICAGO, Jan. 31.—Bud Taylor of Terre Haute, Ind., challenger for the flyweight and bantamweight titles and Pancho Villa, world's flyweight champion, will meet in New York about March 1 according to Eddie Long, manager of Taylor.

Long said he had been asked by Villa's manager not to close any match after February 18 when Taylor meets Sammy Nable at Indianapolis.

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 31.—Walter Miller, Los Angeles, former claimant to the world's middleweight wrestling championship, will meet Heine Engel, Dubuque, Iowa, in a bout here tonight. In the event there are no falls within the two hour limit, their agreement calls for a decision.

CHICAGO, Jan. 31.—The approach of tryouts for places on the American Olympic track and field team has created an increased interest among college athletes being reflected in the broader plans for the annual meets. Announcement of the Illinois indoor relay carnival here March 1 and of the Drake outdoor relays April 25 and 26 at Des Moines have just gone out followed by the prediction of the stimulus of the Olympic assure a record breaking showing of stars.

The coaches in the "big ten" conference and Missouri valley conference report large track squads in training, with several outstanding stars being groomed for the coming competition.

The Drake relays at Des Moines in April are expected to attract nearly 1500 athletes representing over 100 institutions from all parts of the country.

MACON, Ga.—Miles McTigue, the world's light-heavyweight champion, refused to sign articles to meet Young Stripling, Georgia fighter, "Pa" Stripling said.

DES MOINES, Ia.—Ed (Strangler) Lewis, world's heavyweight wrestling champion, defeated Elmer Sanders of New York in straight falls.

BUENOS AIRES, Jan. 31.—Edmundo Spalla, Italian heavyweight, arrived here from Europe today. He appeared to be in good form for his coming match with the winner of the Firpo-Lodge fight. Spalla said he weighed 193 pounds. He has no doubts but that Firpo will beat Lodge and that he will defeat the South American champion.

U. S. HOCKEY TEAM IN SEMI-FINALS

CHAMONIX, France, Jan. 31.—(By Associated Press). The American Olympic hockey team playing under wraps, after the first period, defeated England today, 13 to 9, clinching first place in its end of the draw and reaching the semi-finals. The Yankees tomorrow will play the second team in the upper half, probably Sweden.

BILL MULDOON MADE HEAD OF N. Y. BOXING

NEW YORK, Jan. 31.—Boxing and wrestling circles were recovering today from the shock of the reappointment by Governor Smith of William Muldoon, of White Plains, to the chairmanship of the state athletic commission and the resignation of William J. McCormick from the chairmanship of the state licensing commission in which he took over Muldoon's power.

The governor's action was gratifying to many who have thought recently boxing is "shaking at its foundation and needs a Landis to save it." Others who complained of Muldoon's arbitrariness when he held the reins were pained at his return.

Nevertheless, it was almost universally agreed that Mr. Muldoon would strengthen the sport, for while some of his orders were complained of his purpose never was questioned.

C. C. CHAPMAN OF PORTLAND TO SPEAK HERE ON PROBLEMS

There will be an Agricultural Economic Conference in Medford during the week of February 18th-25th, at which a Jackson county agricultural program will be made up, the success of which will depend upon the interest the farmers and business men of the county put into it.

A meeting has been called by the directors of the Medford Chamber of Commerce of all who attended the agricultural economic conference at the Oregon Agricultural College last week to elect an executive committee to program the three day conference for this county.

On Wednesday evening, February sixth, a meeting of members of the Medford Chamber of Commerce will be held at which a report will be received from the Jackson county delegates who attended the conference at Corvallis and to hear C. C. Chapman of Portland who also attended the conference gave his version of the benefits that will be received when citizens of Oregon get together on a constructive program of development.

The directors of the chamber have for a long time been working on a concerted action for a survey and agricultural program and they are now very hopeful of success. However, the important part is to get every business man acquainted with the plan and in order that this may be accomplished they must have business men attend the meeting next Wednesday and subsequent meetings of the conference in February.

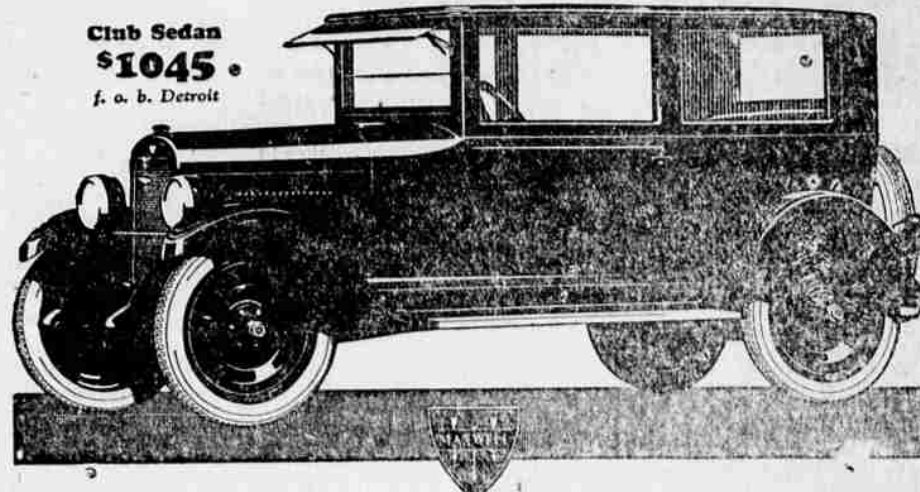
