OREGON LIVESTOCK VALUES DECLINE IN MARKED DEGREE

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 5.—Comments on the livestock situation in Oregon has been assembled by F. L. Kent, statistician of the Department of Agriculture at Portland, from reports in various counties of Oregon. The reports are mostly pessimistic. The total value of all animals enumerated was as follows:

It will be observed that the Oregon values on Jan. 1, 1924, are less than on Jan. 1, 1923, by 2.3 per cent, and less than the high mark of 1920, by 36.2 per cent.

The United States values show a shrinkage during the year 1923, of 5.1 per cent, and a decline from the 1920 values of 39.3 per cent.

In the state a decrease is indicated in numbers of horses, mules and beef cattle, and an increase in milk cows, sheep and swine. It is very probable that the increase in milk cows would have been considerably more had dairy farm labor been available at lower wages.

In the United States a decrease is indicated in numbers of horses, mules, beef cattle and swine, during the year 1923, and small increases in milk cows and sheep.
