

SECY. MELLON IS ATTACKED FOR HIS BONUS OPPOSITION


WASHINGTON, D. C.—Secretary Mellon has failed to consider in his estimates of anticipated revenue the sum of approximately \$160,000,000 annually accrue as interest on the British war debt, twice as much as is needed to pay the adjusted compensation bill, according to John R. Quinn, national commander of the American Legion.

In making this declaration, Commander Quinn added that Secretary Mellon had also failed to take into account the estimated savings of \$220,000,000 to \$250,000,000 which economies of national administration will produce.

The statements were made at the all-day session of Legion's National Legislative committee, held at the hotel Washington when plans for a nation-wide demonstration by ex-service men were laid.

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DRY CLEAN-UP IN CHICAGO TO BE CONTINUED

CHICAGO, Feb. 13.—(By the Associated Press)—Declaring that "law enforcement is a reality in Chicago," Mayor E. Dever, whose campaign against illicit liquor has driven brewers and more than 6000 soft drink parlors out of business during the last four months, served notice today on bootleggers and beer runners that "this storm is not going to blow over."

"The traffic in beer and booze has been halted in Chicago. And it will not be resumed during my administration," the mayor said as he signed orders which increased to 2300 the number of establishments closed by license revocations since September 1, last.

Immediately upon assuming office for a four year term last year, the mayor began an informal private inquiry into the traffic in illegal beverages.

MOONSHINE IS Poured INTO STREET SEWER

PENDLETON, Ore., Feb. 13.—A copper still with a capacity of 50 gallons was brought in from Adams last night by W. R. Taylor, chief of police of Pendleton and as a result of the raid which he conducted Will Leight, Adams man, was fined \$250 and given a thirty day jail sentence in justice court at Athena. Five barrels of mash were found and eight gallons of alleged moonshine in a keg which was duly brought to Pendleton and poured in the gutters before a crowd of W. C. T. U. workers.

DENVER OIL MAN BECAME CONVINCED SINCLAIR CROOKED

WASHINGTON, Feb. 13.—J. Leo Stack, Denver oil man, who has contractual rights in claims in Teapot, told the senate oil committee yesterday that he became convinced soon after Harry F. Sinclair got the lease that "there had been had faith, fraud and secret dealings in the matter."

Stack said information had come to him that Sinclair, Robert W. Stewart of the Standard Oil company of Indiana and H. M. Blackmar, of the Midwest Refining company, a Standard Oil subsidiary, had gotten together at Mexico on the Teapot Dome subject in December, 1921.

RECORD SHIPMENT ROSEBURG TURKEYS

ROSEBURG, Ore., Feb. 13.—The largest carload of turkeys ever shipped out of Douglas county left Drain this week for the Seattle market. It was shipped by the J. T. Bridge company and the birds were gathered from the growers in northern Douglas county. This practically cleans up the entire crop and places thousands of dollars in the hands of the growers.

JAN'Y FIRE LOSS IN OREGON LARGE

SALEM, Ore., Feb. 13.—Fire losses in Oregon during January totaled \$272,150 during the city of Portland, according to the monthly report of Will H. Moore, state fire marshal. Losses of \$10,000 or more were: Astoria, Masonic temple \$25,000; Cove, business block \$20,000; Elgin, warehouse and apples \$17,000; Eugene, garage and apartments \$20,000; La. Pine, garage, grocery, hardware, etc., \$20,000; Ontario, store and contents \$10,000; Pendleton, automobile plant \$15,000; Verona, hardware, garage, contractors office, \$14,000; Wasco, store \$12,000.

FLOODS DISLOCATE TRAIN SERVICE IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

VANCOUVER, B. C., Feb. 13.—Unusual flood conditions are prevailing along the Fraser river valley as a result of the heavy rains and mild weather of the past two days, and train service in Vancouver is somewhat dislocated, owing to washouts and mud slides.

Swollen streams and a rush of water from Sumas lake and Vedder river are threatening the Sumas bridge, which, according to reports, is already two feet out of alignment under pressure of logs brought down stream with the freshet.

S. CAROLINA REFUSES TO LISTEN TO REED

COLUMBIA, S. C., Feb. 13.—The South Carolina house of representatives has withdrawn its invitation to address it, extended to Senator Reed of Missouri, candidate for the democratic nomination for president.

Senator Reed was assailed for his opposition to policies of Woodrow Wilson and also was described during the debate as "a traitor to his country." The resolution withdrawing the invitation states "he does not represent the highest ideals of the people of this state and is not in thorough accord with the democratic party, and, in our opinion would not be supported by the electorate of South Carolina."
