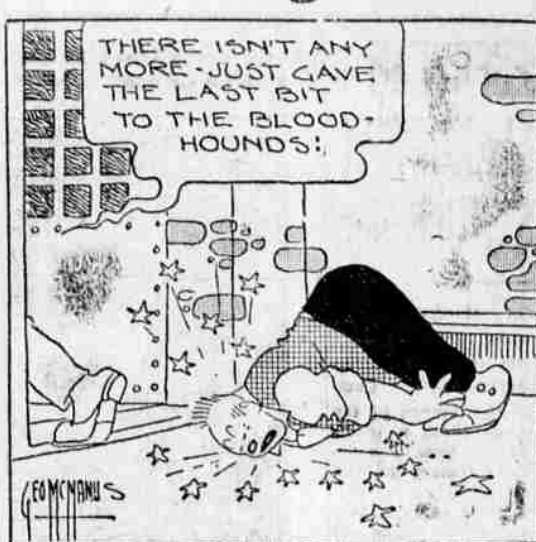

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CHANGE METHOD OF FILLING STREETS IN ASTORIA FIRE ZONE

ASTORIA, Ore., Feb. 13.—The work of filling the streets in the burned district of Astoria will probably not be delayed more than a few days, possibly a week, by the disastrous collapse of a section of the retaining wall at the east end of the burned area Saturday night. It was decided following a conference of engineers to re-inforce the walls throughout the district by heavy steel rods running from one side of the street to the other. These will be drawn tight by turn buckles, thus supporting the walls.

They have already been ordered and will be placed every twenty-five feet throughout the district as soon as a sufficient number are in place dredging will be resumed.
