SMALL FRUITS TO BE STUDIED AT FARM CONFERENCE

The small fruits, such as strawberries, raspberries, blackberries, etc., and vegetables that will be of commercial value will be given consideration at the coming conference. Professor A. G. B. Bouquet of the Oregon Agricultural college will have charge of this group and is recognized as the best authority on the coast in vegetable growing for commercial purposes. A great many people are now interested in this line of work and a good attendance is expected for this group.

A survey will be made of the county to determine the amounts of such products grown and an endeavor will be made to get markets through canneries or fresh fruit and vegetable markets. There is a wonderful opportunity for the expansion of this kind of work in the county, and it should appeal to many farmers with small tracts.

A committee is now working on this work, some of which are located in Ashland and it is believed that growers of the Ashland district will be very much interested in this program. This group will meet in one of the rooms in the Masonic hall.

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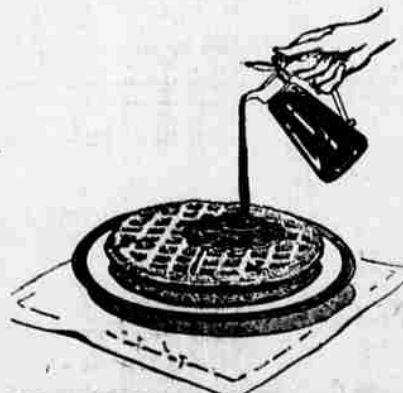
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
