When the farmers and fruitgrowers meet in their respective commodity groups next Monday they will be called to order by the chairman of that group who will call for nominations for the one whom they desire to act as the permanent presiding officer.

A secretary will be the next officer chosen and he will keep the minutes and record the motions which will become a part of the recommendations of the group.

Each group will be called upon to appoint a resolution committee which will have as its duty the framing of the recommendations in a report which will become the permanent record of the conference.

Each group is expected to name one of their number to act as reporter and his duty will be to give the newspapers every item of interest and news that occurred in the particular group which he is called upon to cover.

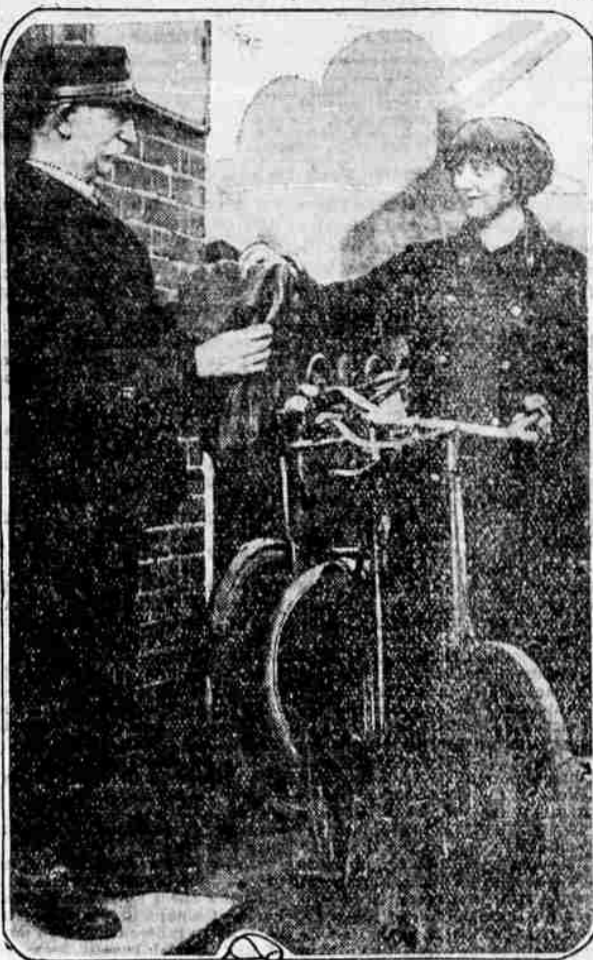

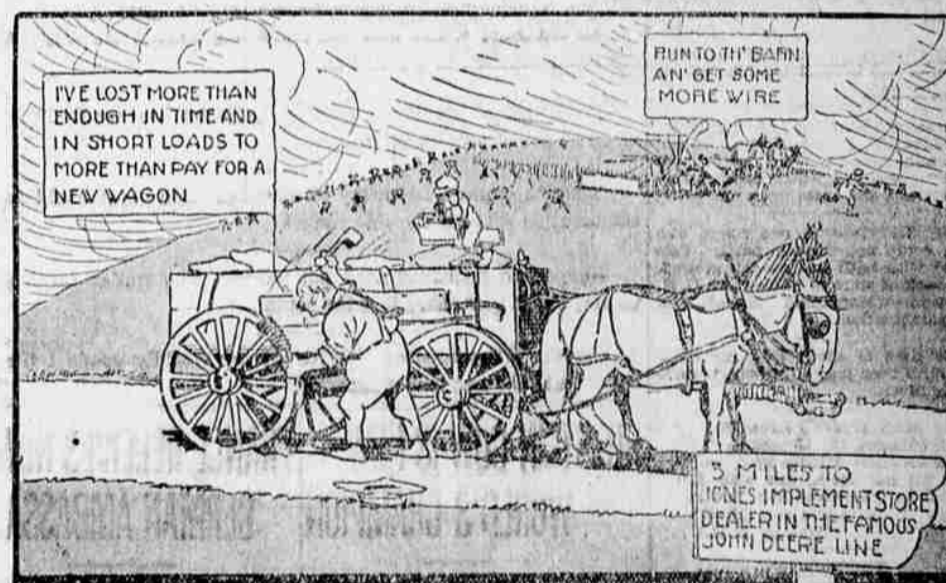
