JAIL ESCAPE IS SENTENCED TO 5 YEARS AT SALEM

Harry Zangley, a slip of a boy, convicted in the circuit court of burglary, and whose dash for liberty escapades have occupied prominent spots in the news was sentenced to five years in the state prison at Salem Tuesday by Circuit Judge Charles M. Thomas. The youth will be taken to Salem tonight by the sheriff. Zangley appeared for sentence handcuffed.

Zangley leaped from a train in California last week, was recaptured at San Jose, Calif., and broke and ran from his captors, only to be halted again when bullets whistled about him in a railroad yard, was brought back Monday night by Deputy Forecrook. On the trip back, he tried to chew through the chain of the handcuffs, and marks of his teeth show in a soft spot, where the links had been soldered.

Zangley was tried and convicted for breaking into the Economy Groceria in this city and last October, with four others, broke out of the jail. He was arrested at Pomona, Calif., two weeks ago under the name of Sandmire.

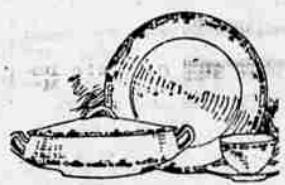
