U. S. CONSTABULARY IN MANILA KILL 3 MORE FANATICS

MANILA, Feb. 26.—(By Associated Press.) Three more religious fanatics have been killed by the constabulary in the mountains of Agusan province, near the scene of last week's battle in which nine constabulary soldiers and 35 fanatics died, stated a message received today at constabulary headquarters here. The three slain, explained the message, had returned to the scene to await the resurrection of their dead comrades.

Manila police said today that the fanatics supposed to be affiliated with the Colorum, a religious organization which lost many belligerent members in recent clashes with the constabulary, is becoming active in Manila and its environs. While no violence has taken place, both police and constabulary have the fanatics under surveillance to prevent any large number of them from assembling in a meeting.

The gunboat Sacramento which shelled the fanatics on Bucas Island, Surigao province a month ago, has rejoined the Asiatic fleet.
