JACKSON COUNTY HAS \$248,754 ON DEPOSIT IN BANKS

According to the February report of the treasurer's office, there was on deposit in the banks of Jackson county, March 1st, \$248,754.79 of county funds, protected by securities amounting to \$517,990.

Warrant indebtedness, road bonds, totalled \$119,327.86. Of this sum \$9,443.42 was for warrants called but not presented for payment, and \$109,884.44 outstanding but not called.

Outstanding warrants, for prohibition enforcement, uncalled, \$1,641.45. For current expense and county fair expenditures warrants to the amount of \$20,630.76 were outstanding.

The general fund warrants uncalled and outstanding, totalled \$2,129.92.
