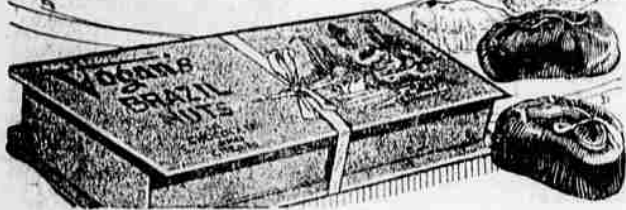

TAG DAY FOR GIRL PROTECTIVE HOME MEDFORD, SAT.

To the Editor: Tag Day will be on Saturday, March 8, for Medford's share of the burden in caring for the nameless, homeless, and abandoned babies of Oregon division of the Pacific Coast Rescue and Protective Society. This nursery cared for 182 babies from one day old to five years.

This is a special drive for the purpose of purchasing a dairy herd and the building of modern, sanitary barns for the cows. By having our own herd of cows, knowing just how they are fed and cared for, we know better results and much difficulty arising from milk gotten from different herds will be overcome.

These little ones for the most part are nameless foundlings, cheated out of their birthright. No charge is made for the care of the babies in the nursery unless a voluntary support is given those having one parent, or some relative as the case may be. This fund is also for the purpose of paying for the new heating plant installed last summer.

It means more than can always be readily seen on the surface to stand by a splendid and noble effort such as this society is putting forth, to lift up the little girl who has mis-stepped and often ignorantly gone to her ruin. So many of our girls have lost their mothers when very young, growing up without any care or knowledge of the pitfalls just ahead for the unsuspecting feet. Parental negligence is one of the chief causes of delinquency.

Heart to heart, and very effective talks are being given each high school girl and girls from 12 years up, on sex-education and dangers in social looseness, as a means to prevent the wrong-doing of ignorant youngsters.

Cases are being reported and investigated all along the line where our workers travel. Each town, hamlet and village is carefully considered, and delinquent and wayward girls taken in training, without any red tape, or charges made.

One bad apple taken from a box of good ones saves the rest. Just so a girl of loose morals will spoil lives of those with whom she associates.

This work is purely non-sectarian, and it is the duty of every citizen to uphold our effort in protection and correction, by co-operating every way possible to being about cleaner and better conditions in your own community. When the little hands are brought to you don't turn a deaf ear, but dig down and sacrifice if necessary, and buy one tag at least and as many more as you possibly can and help care for these unfortunate babies and develop good womanhood from thoughtless girls.

CRATERS EDITION OF MAIL TRIBUNE WILL BE HOT ONE

The Craters club with Charles Goff Thomson as editor in chief will publish and edit the Mail Tribune on Tuesday, April 1st. An arrangement with Crater Cole Holmes has been made for a \$100,000 indemnity policy protecting the owners of the Tribune against suit for libel and breakage of mechanical equipment. All the features of the daily Mail Tribune from editorials and society to the Smudge Pot column will be found in their usual places but with Craters in complete charge. The paper will be a sixteen page edition but cannot be classed as a yellow sheet as it is to be printed in red ink.

The Craters have for several months felt the need of making exposures of local conditions that in news value will rival the Teapot Dome scandal. Furthermore several public insinuations about this organization have been published which will be dealt with in a separate feature.

Inasmuch as 5000 extra copies will be sold on the streets with Head Newshy Cap Vance in charge, it behooves local advertisers to arrange immediately for their advertising. Solicitors will be in the field within a few days allotting to the various merchants the remaining available space. It is estimated that this edition will be read by at least 50,000 people but advertising rates will be exceptionally low.

Anonymous communications need not be sent in as only letters written and signed by local residents will be given consideration. This edition is not a money making scheme but it is undertaken solely with the idea of giving the people of Medford and vicinity a true picture in newspaper style of conditions as they really exist.

Story of Deadly Arizona Feud Is "To the Last Man"

Not a motion picture based on a story, but a photodrama which actually breathes the spirit of the original tale and personality of the author, "To the Last Man," a Zane Grey production opening at the Rialto theatre today.

Gaston Isabel, leader of the cattlemen and Lee Jorth, leader of the sheepmen, are old enemies. Both have come to the Tonto Basin from Texas with their sympathizers. Knowing that a fight is coming, Gaston Isabel sends for his son Jean, who is a trapper in Oregon. Meeting Ellen, Jorth's daughter, on his way to the valley, Jean falls in love with her.

Later when Jean traces cattle rustlers to the Jorth ranch, the Jorths retaliate by raiding the Isabel home. In the battle, Guy Isabel and one of the children are killed. The following day, Gaston is shot down treacherously and the Isabels pursue the Jorths. In an ambush, all the Isabels are wiped out except Jean, who carries on the fight single-handed. He kills the last of the Jorth sympathizers and ends by marrying Ellen. Thus the feud is ended.

It is the story of the lives of primitive men with primitive hates and a love of fighting. Lois Wilson, Richard Dix, Frank Campeau, Robert Edeson and Noah Beery are the principal players.

"The Fool," Vining, Ashland, March 17

Channing Pollock's great play of love, romance and the finer things in life, "The Fool," which will have its local premiere at the Vining theatre, Ashland, Monday night, March 7, has been the outstanding success of the decade in New York. The noted playwright has made a radical departure from the paths which he has followed so successfully in the past; and the importance of this new offering may be judged by the fact that he was at work on it for no less than ten years. In brief, it deals with the struggles of an idealist—a young minister who, forced from a fashionable New York pulpit for his outspoken condemnation of sham and selfishness plunges bravely into the industrial pit, and becomes the champion of the oppressed and the unfortunate. CRATERS INVITED TO ATTEND BIG MEETING ROSEBURG

ROSEBURG, Ore., March 7.—Plans are being formulated here for a convention of the booster clubs of Oregon and the Prunarians of Vancouver, Wash., to consider ways and means of extending hospitality to the tourists visiting the state, and to co-operate to a greater extent in advertising the various scenic attractions which Oregon has to offer. The convention plan was conceived at the King's council of the Salem Cherrians and R. O. Snelling, chancellor of the rose, was directed to confer with the Umpqua Chiefs to see if arrangements could be made to hold the convention in Roseburg, which is most centrally located for such an event. The clubs which will be invited to participate are the Cherrians of Salem, Lithians of Ashland, Pelicans of Klamath Falls, Craters of Medford, Cavemen of Grants Pass, Pirates of Coos Bay, Gobblers of Oakland, Herrians of Newberg, Rosarians of Portland, Prunarians of Vancouver and the Umpqua Chiefs of Roseburg.

The tentative plans were arranged here today, and letters will be sent out by the Cherrians to all clubs inviting them to participate and to secure expressions regarding the most suitable date. The Umpqua Chiefs propose a big celebration in connection with the strawberry carnival to be held the latter part of May. The Umpqua Chiefs are to furnish the entertainment and arrange the program for the conference which is to be held in Roseburg because this city is more centrally located and easily reached by all of the booster clubs.

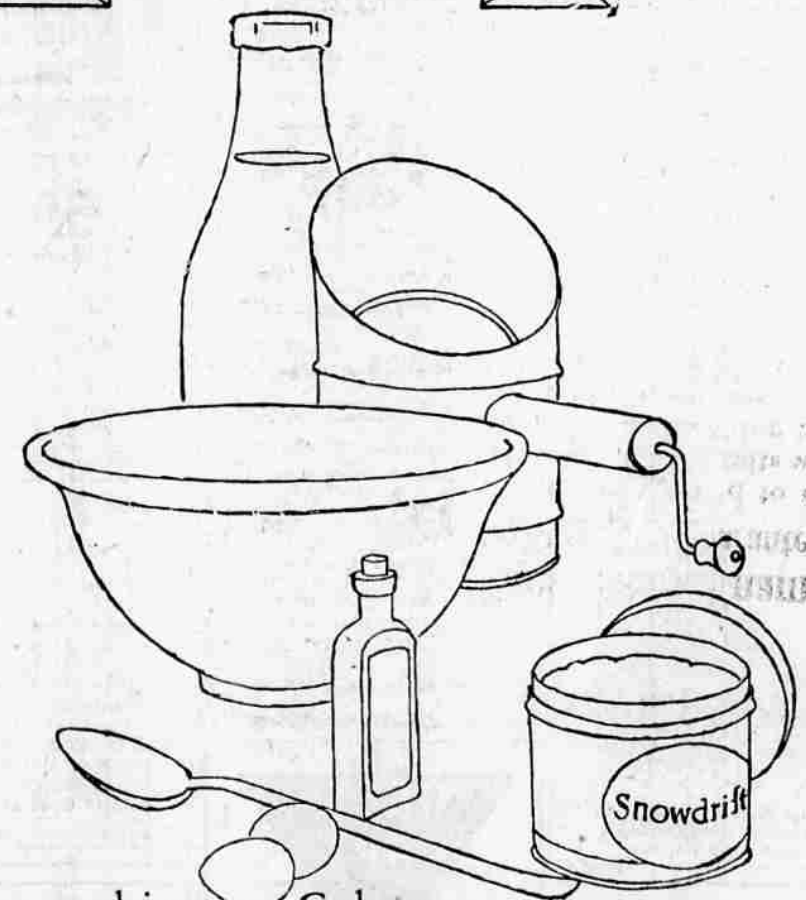

5 whites of eggs
1½ cupsful sugar
3½ cupsful Snowdrift
1 cupful liquid (water preferred)
2¼ cupsful flour
2¼ teaspoonfuls baking powder
1 teaspoonful salt
1½ teaspoonful extract (1 tsp. vanilla—½ tsp. orange or lemon juice, or any desired flavor)
Cream Snowdrift at 1 sugar thoroughly, adding liquid from time to time until one-third cupful has been used. Sift the flour, baking powder and salt together several times. Alternately add balance of the liquid and flour, fold in whites of beaten eggs and extract, and bake in loaf pan. Requires fifty minutes in oven 300° F., gradually increasing and when cake is thoroughly risen increase the temperature to about 400° F., for a few minutes to harden walls of air cells. Remove the cover and reduce the temperature for balance of time.
