

PER CAPITA WEALTH IN OREGON \$4182, TOTAL 3 BILLIONS

WASHINGTON, Mar. 11.—Details of the wealth of six states at the close of 1922 were made public today by the census bureau. They are: Iowa's wealth was \$18,511,682,000, an increase of 37.2 per cent over 1921, with a per capita wealth of \$4274, an increase of 24.1 per cent.

Minnesota's wealth was \$8,547,918,000, an increase of 58.9, with a per capita wealth of \$4143, an increase of 37.4 per cent.

Nebraska's wealth was \$5,320,075,000, an increase of 44.2 per cent, with a per capita wealth of \$4004, an increase of 32.4 per cent.

Oregon's wealth was \$3,419,459,000, an increase of 68.3 per cent, with a per capita wealth of \$4182, an increase of 50.4 per cent.

Colorado's wealth was \$3,229,352,000, an increase of 40.9 per cent, with a per capita wealth of \$3285, an increase of 32.86 cents.

Montana's wealth was \$2,223,007,000, an increase of 58.2 per cent, with a per capita wealth of \$3691, an increase of 33.56 per cent.

MANY CHANGES ON NATION'S FARMS

WASHINGTON, Mar. 11.—Almost one-fifth of the country's farms had new occupants in 1922. Five southern states showed changes in more than a quarter of their farms, the department of agriculture announced today after a survey of the situation, and only six states, all in New England, showed less than 10 per cent change in their farm occupants. In most of the corn belt and western states changes ranged from 10 to 15 percent.

The chief cause of the turnover is believed by agricultural experts to be the attractiveness of new land.

HOLLYWOOD LAWYER ASKS BIG FEE

LOS ANGELES, Mar. 11.—Suit for \$245,000 in attorneys' fees sought by Herman L. Roth, Hollywood attorney from Mrs. Ola Humphrey Hansen Broadwood of Oakland, Cal., former wife of the late Prince Ibrahim Hussein of Egypt, was scheduled to go to trial in the superior court today but a continuance of the case was expected in view of the fact that Roth is now under sentence for attempted extortion.

Roth alleges he obtained \$4,000,000 for Mrs. Broadwood from Prince Hussein's estate, but never received the fifty per cent commission promised him.

FORD PLANT PLANS TO SAVE WOOD

DETROIT, Mich., March 11.—Plans to salvage 89 per cent of the wood now thrown away is the aim of an order issued by the Ford Motor Co. to all its branches to save all wood coming in and to use precaution to see that no board is broken unnecessarily.

According to Ford Co. officials, it has been demonstrated in the last 30 days that a huge saving can be effected. Experiments at the Highland Park plant here show that where previously 26 carloads of wood was taken away each week as useless except for firewood, under the new plan only four carloads are now consigned for such use.

The company's yearly requirements are 300,000,000 board feet of lumber.

Train Derailed

IRISH ARMY FUSS QUIETED, REAL FACT OF REVOLT SECRET

LONDON, Mar. 11.—Dispatches from Dublin correspondents today say that the trouble in the free state army has been of much wider effect than the official report admits.

Dissatisfaction with the changes in the army is general, say the correspondents and the public has not heard all that has happened. It is stated also that there is a political angle to the affair, and rumor is that one member of the government has resigned while some of the deputies intend to resign their seats in the Dail Eireann.

General Owen O'Duffy's appointment to the newly created post of commander of defense forces is believed in some quarters to indicate that the position is more serious than appears on the surface.

There were incidents in Dublin yesterday recalling the recent troubles, with the rapid movement of armaments and horses carrying armed soldiers through the streets and now and then a low flying airplane.

At one time a party of forty soldiers, handcuffed in pairs, was marched through the streets under strong escort. Whether they were mutineers was not learned.

Major General Liam Tobin and Colonel Charles Dalton, alleged leaders of the mutiny, continue at liberty.

DUBLIN, Mar. 11.—Free state army headquarters announced early today that the situation following the recently suppressed mutiny was absolutely normal in all commands.

MEXICAN REBELS IN RUSH TO QUIT

MEXICO CITY, Mar. 11.—(By Associated Press.) The continued surrender of rebel leaders is reported. General Jose Dominguez Ramirez Garrido, formerly of the staff of General Enrique Estrada, Jalisco rebel commander, has given himself up in Mexico City, it is said.

According to dispatches from Guadalajara, General Jesus Novoa, another Estrada follower, has surrendered in that city while Petrolino Flores has turned over his forces, numbering about 1000 men to General Joaquin Amaro at Sayula.

President Obregon is due to arrive today at Manzanillo, where he will meet Mrs. Obregon and other members of the family, enroute from Hermosillo to Mexico City. Senora Obregon was escorted from Mazatlan by General Angel Flores, governor of Sinaloa, and Presidential candidate.

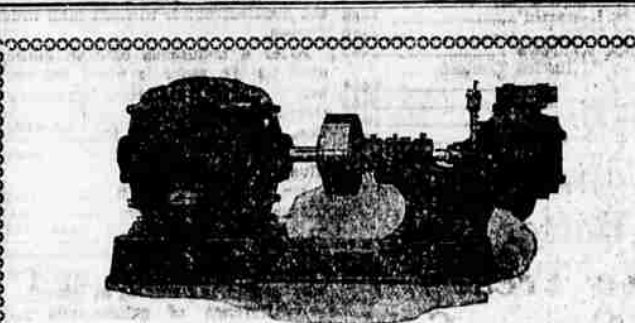
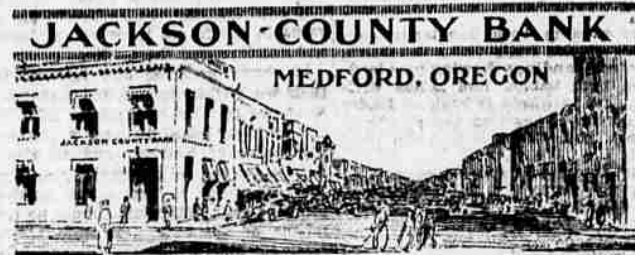
