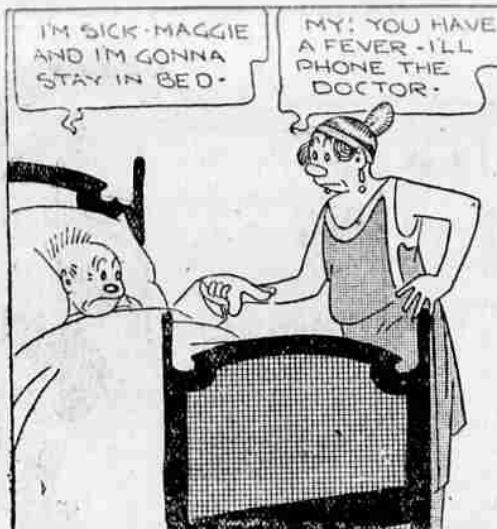

ASK YANKEE AID TO KEEP WARSHIP

TOKIO, March 17.—(By the Associated Press)—Nationwide sentiment for preservation of the old battleship Mikasa, flagship of Admiral Heihachiro Togo in the battle of the Sea of Japan in 1905, took definite form today when a deputation of American educated Japanese called upon American Ambassador Cyrus E. Woods and solicited his good offices in obtaining the consent of the United States government that the historic vessel be not completely destroyed. The Mikasa has already undergone the first stage of scrapping in accordance with the naval limitations agreement. The ambassador assured the delegation he was in sympathy with its aims but reminded the members that the request must come through diplomatic channels before he could act officially. He added that when the proposal was presented officially he would give his assistance toward preservation of the relic of the Japanese navy's greatest triumph. It is expected the foreign office in response to pressure from influential sources shortly will approach Ambassador Woods and the ambassadors of other signatory powers to seek an agreement whereby the Mikasa may be retained as a monument.

ACCUSED BOY AND DAD IN TACOMA

TACOMA, Mar. 17.—Kenneth Ross MacLean, facing charges of manslaughter in Maine for the death of his infant daughter there on February 28, reached his home in Tacoma yesterday accompanied by his father, A. R. MacLean, wealthy local businessman. Young MacLean is free on \$20,000 bail pending action by the grand jury here in May. Neither made any effort to conceal their presence in the city but neither would make a statement concerning the case on advice of their local attorney, Maurice Langhorne. Kenneth will call on his wife, Nettie also charged with manslaughter in connection with the baby's death, as soon as she has recovered from her present shattered physical condition to receive visitors, the elder MacLean said.
