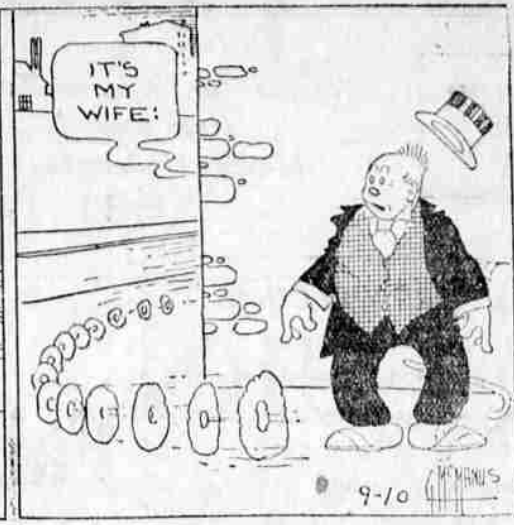

ATTORNEYS IN FAILING CASE LOSE \$150,000

SALEM, Ore., Sept. 9.—Coy Burnett, Edwin E. Heckbert and Russell E. Sewell, Portland attorneys, will receive only \$21,000 in attorney fees, instead of \$150,000, for their work as counsel for W. Tyler Smith, next of kin of the late Mrs. Xarifa F. Failing, in a suit contesting her will. This is the decree of the state supreme court in an opinion handed down today and written by Justice Brown. The lawyers demanded a third of the estate. Mrs. Failing died July 5, 1917, leaving an estate of about \$300,000. On July 9, says the record, Thomas W. Strong and O. L. Mead, offered for probate a purported will, dated August 26, 1915, naming several legatees who were to receive \$3000 each, all of the rest of the estate, amounting to about \$450,000 to go to Strong and Mead, in equal shares. They were nominated in the will as executors and were so appointed.

On grounds that Mrs. Failing was not of sound mind when this will was made, W. Tyler Smith, as next of kin, brought suit to have the will declared invalid, and Burnett, Heckbert and Sewell were his attorneys.

In the course of the trial evidence developed that in 1911 Xarifa Failing had made a will to which she later added six codicils, and that in this will, the disposition of her property was wholly different from that of the probated will. Petitioners allege that upon learning of the 1911 will assignments certain bequests made by that will were executed and delivered to W. Tyler Smith, and that on July 2, 1918, an amended petition on behalf of Smith was filed in the contest, also on behalf of all other beneficiaries under the 1911 will. When this went to court it is said 82 days were consumed in hearing testimony, and the probate court sustained the will of 1915. An appeal was taken to the circuit court where the trial occupied fifteen days, and the circuit court upheld the probate court. Appeal was taken to the supreme court which reserved the lower court.

One of the main beneficiaries was the Children's home in Portland, and Justice Brown's opinion states that if fees are paid from the funds of the estate the children's home would be the principal payer.

W. Tyler-Smith, principal in the above action is the father of Tyler Smith, a Medford resident and former circulation manager of the Medford Sun.

GRANTS PASS WINS NEXT CONVENTION IRRIGATION CONG.

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., Sept. 10.—Selection of Grants Pass as the meeting place for next year and election of officers marked the closing session of the fourteenth annual Oregon State Irrigation congress which closed last night with a banquet. The new officers are: James M. Kyle, Stanfield, president; Wilford Allen, Grants Pass, first vice president; E. E. Lago, Hood River, second vice president; D. V. McBain, Ontario, third vice president; A. B. Schroeder, Harney county, fourth vice president and W. E. Meacham, Baker, secretary. Of the twelve resolutions passed by the congress the two most important were opposing Governor Pierce's stand in the attempt to repeal the state guarantee of interest on reclamation bonds.
