

Tyler Smith, and that on July 2. 1918, an amended petition on behalf of Smith was filed in the contest, also on behalf of all other beneficiaries under the 1911 will. When this went to court it is said \$2 days were consumed in bearing testimony, and the sumed in hearing testimony, and the probate court sustained the will of 1815. An appeal was taken to the circuit court where the trial occupied fifteen days, and the circuit court upheld the probate court. Appeal was taken to the supreme court which

reserved the lower court.

the principal payer.

"We have no power." says the opinion "to recognize a contingent contract that was never made by the

purpose, has no merit in a court of
equity."
