

DAVIS FIRM FOR LEAGUE AS ONLY HOPE FOR PEOPLE

ALBANY, N. Y., Oct. 7.—Driving further north and west into New York state from Albany to Utica for a noon-day address, and thence to Syracuse for an evening meeting, John W. Davis continued today his attacks against the republican party, its record during the Harding and Coolidge administrations and his appeal for support of the voters for the democratic national and state tickets in the November elections.

At the same time Mr. Davis, speaking as the democratic presidential nominee reiterated his opposition to the administration's foreign policy, charged that the navy has deteriorated in efficiency below the 5-3 ratio fixed by the Washington armament conference and reviewed other subjects touched upon in his address here last night.

In his reference to the foreign policy questions, Mr. Davis said last night he could see only two courses open to this country. One was to turn the nation to the point where it need not fear aggression even from the

United strength of other powers and the second was to meet all other powers in conference and build up understandings which would make future aggression impossible.

He pointed out the refusal of the Washington government to attend the Geneva conference called by the League of Nations to consider questions of abolishing war, of arbitration, of reduction in armaments and the codification of international law.

"There is neither safety nor honor in a mere policy of drift," Mr. Davis said. "Such a policy leads inevitably to a situation that not only deprives us of the power to make up our minds but also the chance to make our will effective when our minds are made up. The country has a right to know whether we have a foreign policy and if so, what that policy is."

In a repetition of his charges of corruption in public office during the last three and a half years, Mr. Davis declared that the republican party "cannot cover its failure to perform its past promises by making new promises for the future."

"The worst crop failure this country ever saw," he said, "is the failure in the crop of republican performance compared with the sowing of republican promises."

Another question to be settled at the elections, Mr. Davis said, was that of rule of privilege as against the rule of equality.

"Of all the victories which privilege ever won in congress," he said, "in this connection, none was so sweeping as the present iniquitous Fordney-McCumber tariff. Its rates were written by the very men who hoped to profit from them."

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DUEL FOUGHT OVER ELECTION CHARGES

BUENOS AIRES, Oct. 7.—(By Associated Press.) Dr. Thomas Le Breton and Deputy Molinari were both slightly wounded after a brief encounter in an affair of honor at midnight last night. The duel was fought with sabres.

Deputy Molinari was charged by Dr. LeBreton with the publication of a newspaper article which the latter in his position as minister of agriculture, considered offensive. Dr. LeBreton tendered his resignation as minister to the president in order to fight the duel.

Molinari has also been challenged by three members of the chamber of deputies, who took umbrage at similar articles which they considered offensive.

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
