BUTLER PREDICTS VICTORY, PEOPLE URGED TO VOTE

CHICAGO, Nov. 3.—Chairman William M. Butler of the republican national committee, issued a statement last night to republican party workers and leaders. He said: "To all the men and women of the republican party who have given unstintingly of their time and energy in this work I want to express my sincere appreciation. Our work has been harmonious. Throughout the land, down into the smallest precincts, wonderful, unselfish service has been given. Victory will reward their efforts. "Those who are fighting battles are always subjected to criticism. Fair criticism is never resented but our national committee has most unjustly been charged with 'slush fund' tactics. SHAVER DECLARES DAVIS WILL WIN

NEW YORK, Nov. 3.—Clem L. Shaver, chairman of the democratic national committee in a final statement said: "John W. Davis will be the next president of the United States. The issue of the campaign has been squarely met by the candidate in a matchless way. He has shown absolute confidence in the intelligence, integrity and patriotism of the American people. There has been no evasion, no camouflage, no flinching. Notwithstanding the overwhelming preponderance of the republican press he has broken through the wire entanglements of deception, evasion and propaganda. His sterling worth, ability and honesty, the things that go to make a great president, the things that put trust and confidence in government, all these are now before the people, and they are thinking."

FUNERAL DIRGE BY 8000 IS SAID

NELSON, B. C., Nov. 3.—While 8,000 persons raised their voices in a funeral dirge, Peter Lordly, known as Peter Veregin, head of the Russian religious sect of Doukhorob, who was killed in an explosion on a train at Vancouver on Oct. 9, was buried yesterday in a sepulchre blasted from rock on a height overlooking Brilliant, the headquarters of the sect. From morning until the sun set, the worshippers sang and listened to eulogies of their dead leader. The explosion which caused the deaths of nine and the injury of more than a dozen, was caused by a bomb placed beneath Veregin's seat by an enemy who opposed his progressive farming ideas, the authorities believed.
