

SERVANT WITH AX RUNS AMUCK AND THREE ATTACKED

PLAINSVILLE, N. J., Nov. 25.—Physicians last night pronounced insane Mary Kusmak, who early yesterday attacked a family of three with an axe, while they slept, killing one, and probably fatally injuring another. George H. Davy, 59, was killed, his head having nearly been severed. His invalid wife, sleeping on the face and throat that hospital in another room, was so critically cut authorities said she might not live. A daughter, Winifred, 14, attempted to escape to the street and was slashed across the cheek. The mad woman was a servant in the Davy home. Screams of Mrs. Davy and her daughter aroused neighbors. Two men arrived in time to rescue Mrs. Davy. They summoned police, who put the servant in a straight jacket. "The Lord told me to do it," the servant told the police. She is 32 years of age and came from Poland fourteen years ago. Neighbors said she had attended church regularly and had never given any indication of an unbalanced mind.

"Treasure Island," "Pied Piper of Hamelin" Armory, Dec. 4

"Yo! Ho! And a bottle of rum!" do a host of other things—just like real people. Lately miniature stage sets, elaborate lighting and scenic effects and specially arranged music add to the charm of the marionette performance. Tony Sarg is known the world over for the novel work he is doing with his "wooden headed actors."

"Treasure Island" includes scenes at the inn before the adventure really got under way, the usual confusion of the docks, before any properly maritime expedition can set forth, a lively disagreement on board the pirate ship, a beautiful setting in the woods, a fight near the stockade, the pirate ship at sea, in a severe storm while a fight on board prevents any exhibition of seamanship, and two final scenes on the island.

Mr. Sarg has gathered together a company of ten puppeteers which excel any he has ever had in the past. In addition to the technical requirements of handling the puppets, each member of the present company had to show a remarkable good voice, special dramatic instinct, a strong voice of pleasing quality, and the ability to play one or more musical instruments. There is hardly a moment throughout the "Pied Piper" when there is no music accompaniment, and the Pirate Chorus of "Treasure Island" is declared to be the finest thing of its sort ever attempted.
