GERMANY EXPECTS NEW CABINET BY SUNDOWN TODAY

BERLIN, Jan. 8.—(By the Associated Press)—Chancellor Marx is making a final effort to complete an emergency cabinet before sundown today. President Ebert authorized him, after the failure to get together a representative non-partisan cabinet to fill vacancies in the positive cabinet's ranks with under secretaries from the various ministries.

Such a makeshift cabinet as is contemplated would contain official members of the clerical and democratic parties, only as Dr. Gustav Stresemann, foreign minister, and Dr. Karl Jarres, minister of the interior would retire in keeping with the German people's party resolution not to participate in a government comprising the bourgeois and socialist parties.

Chancellor Marx, Minister of Finance, L. Pflger, Minister of Defense, Gessler, Minister of Labor, Brauns and Food Minister Count Von Kanitz are expected to retain their portfolios with Chancellor Marx temporarily taking over the foreign office.

The chancellor expects to take his new cabinet before the reichstag Saturday in connection with his presentation of the government's program.
