

TALENT IRRIGATION SUBJECT OF TALK AT KIWANIS CLUB

The Kiwanis club listened to a talk on the work of the Talent Irrigation District Monday by the engineer, F. C. Dillard. After telling of the preliminary work leading up to the organization of the district and the benefits it means to the valley, Mr. Dillard said:

"There are 13,000 irrigable acres in the district of which 600 are in the city of Ashland. There are 4300 acres in fruit of which all are peaches except 600, 3800 acres of alfalfa, 3000 acres in grain, berries, vegetables, etc., or in process there for. And the balance in brush and other lands. There are 75.8 miles of canals, three sources of supply, High Prairie, Little Applegate, and Emory Creek.

Bonds for the first unit were voted in 1919, second 1922, third in 1924, the total issue being \$1,215,000 of which \$22,500 have become due and are paid.

The construction cost of the first unit was \$68,671, and maintenance thru life of bonds, \$8.25 per acre. Second unit \$98.40 per acre, \$10 maintenance. Third unit \$107.70 per acre, \$11 maintenance.

The total cost of the system was all spent at home except about \$100,000. O. C. Boggs, president of the planning commission, explained the reason they had brought H. R. Douglas and H. P. Rainey, experts, here from the University of Oregon to make a school survey, to aid in working out a plan whereby sentiment would be crystallized for the new high school. The visitors were guests, were introduced and Mr. Douglas said the university considered it an honor to be called upon to assist Medford in this forward movement for education and progress.

Emil Mohr called attention to the Crater Lake Temple band dance Wednesday evening and urged all to attend to help secure a fund to send the band east to take part in the national band concert and to play in several large cities and advertise the Rogue River valley.

It was decided to attend the meeting of the Rosebush club Tuesday noon, April 21st and to put on the program there.

The annual meeting and banquet and a dinner dance of the Medford club will be held at Jackson Hot Springs on the evening of May 6th.

It was decided to appropriate \$15 to help pay the D. O. K. K. band for playing at the county track meet, April 25th at the fair grounds.

The Klamath Falls club extended an invitation to attend their meeting April 23rd.

R. B. Hammond received the attendance prize, a silk "something", offered by Mann's store.

The guests were H. R. Douglas and H. P. Rainey, Eugene; Elmer Wilson and A. H. Miller, representing the school board; J. B. Coan, Emil Mohr and O. C. Boggs of the planning commission, and D. Wood of Grants Pass.

FOREST FIRE PLANES AT EUGENE AGAIN FOR \$925 FIRE SEASON

EUGENE, Ore., April 14.—Four United States army airplanes will be stationed at the municipal aviation field in Eugene this summer for the forest fire patrol base for western Oregon, according to word received from United States Senator Charles McNary. Each of the four planes will have a personnel of three fliers, according to the announcement.

Although it had been recently assumed that Eugene had been selected as forest air patrol base again this year, the details of the organization were not given.

The reserve corps of the army air service will provide the aviators on patrol duty for the first time since the establishment of the patrol base here five years ago.

MERCHANTS ARE TOLD OF STATE MEETING BY LOCAL DEALERS

The Jackson County Merchants' association at its regular meeting last evening, listened to reports of the state convention of merchants, held at the U. of O. in Eugene recently, by Clarence Meeker and John C. Mann, both of whom showed the merchants of this county and the state are working to secure better marketing and business conditions for the producer as well as the consumer and business man.

Mr. Meeker paid a high tribute to the notable work being done by the school of business administration of the University of Oregon and said that department leads all other universities in the United States in research work of this kind. He said the outstanding features of this year's work will be retail organization, accounting and what customers think of retail stores.

Mr. Meeker closed by telling of the benefit he had received from attending two of these meetings and said he believed every live merchant owes it to himself and his business to get away a few days out of each year, to mingle with his fellow merchants, exchange ideas and systems, and learn new ideas.

Mr. Mann told of the reception given them by the men in charge at the university and of the benefit derived in belonging to the local organization which is in touch with the state and national organizations.

Short talks were made by several merchants, all saying the Wednesday specials were very successful and urging that the best bargains possible be offered by every merchant. It was stated there was a marked increase of buyers from northern California as well as different sections of the county and all southern Oregon.

B. W. Paul called attention to the field meet to be held at the fair grounds April 25 and the association voted \$30 to help pay for the D. O. K. K. band for the occasion.

Weeks & Orr and Mr. McDonald, the new proprietor of Jones' Grocery, were admitted as members. President John Mann announced the committees for this year and stated Clarence Meeker had been chosen as a member of the board of directors in place of C. L. Roberts.

Time to Spray

Pear Spraying
In order to protect pears from Saw Fly Larvae and Canker Worm, pears should be sprayed with arsenate of lead, regular strength, just as soon as petals fall. Anxious and Bartlett can be sprayed at the present time, while Bosc and Winter Nells will probably be ready latter part of the week. However, where varieties are mixed, spraying can be delayed until next week, when all varieties can be covered. Arsenate of lead at this time, will also aid in controlling codling moth, as it is possible to fill calices to good advantage at this time. In sections where scab has been present in the past, it would be well to add liquid lime sulphur at the rate of one gallon to fifty gallons of spray or dry lime sulphur at rate of two to three pounds to fifty gallons.

Apple Spraying
All apples should be sprayed thoroughly with arsenate of lead just as soon as the petals are off. In large tracts, spraying should begin when about 50 to 75 per cent of the petals have fallen. The calyx cups of the apples close very quickly after the petals fall, and unless this spray is applied at the proper time, it is almost impossible to control the worms later in the season. The same percentage of lime sulphur should be applied in sections where scab is present. This has been a rainy season, and scab will likely show up more this year than in the past seasons. One pound of powdered arsenate of lead to fifty gallons of water is standard, but it is probably best to use one and one-half pounds to fifty gallons or two pounds to two hundred gallons on both apples and pears.

TWO NEW MAIL CARRIERS ADDED TO LOCAL FORCE

An improved and extended city delivery service will be inaugurated in Medford on Thursday, Postmaster W. J. Warner having been authorized by the postoffice department to make an addition of two regular carriers to the present force, which will give Medford eight regular city carriers and a delivery service equal to that of any city.

A complete reorganization of the service will be made, present routes adjusted so that all scheduled trips will be completed much earlier than heretofore, additional territory within the present delivery limits will be served, and the present delivery limits extended to take in certain streets which have not been within the delivery limits.

All streets within the present limits will be served which meet the requirements of the postoffice department in the matter of sidewalks, cross walks, and street improvements, and the present limits are extended so as to include the following streets, which have been improved to meet requirements:

One block south on Holly, two blocks south on Ivy, 3 1/2 blocks on South Peach from 11th street to Dakota avenue, 2 blocks on Columbia avenue, from Main to 4th street, 2 blocks on Oakdale from West Second to Haven, 1 block west on Clark to Taft avenue, one block east on Queen Ann avenue to Beauford street, one-half block south on S. Grape street.

Attention of all patrons residing on these new extensions is called to the fact that before delivery service will be started it will be necessary for patrons to provide a mail receptacle. This is a ruling made by the post office department, and will in no case be disregarded.

Substitute carriers Harold P. Bignall and Marion E. Harper have been appointed by Postmaster Warner to fill the new positions.

BISHOP A. CRISTIE'S FUNERAL TOMORROW

PORTLAND, Ore., April 14.—The body of the late Archbishop Alexander Christie of the Catholic see of Oregon City, who died recently, lay in state today in St. Mary's cathedral here, awaiting funeral services tomorrow.

The Right Rev. A. F. Schinner of Spokane will celebrate pontifical high mass tomorrow at 10:30 a. m., assisted by bishops and clergymen of the Catholic church from all parts of the Pacific coast.

The body was taken to the cathedral this morning and at ten o'clock a mass was said by the Right Rev. A. Hillebrand, vicar general and administrator, who has been named to assume the duties of the late archbishop pending appointment of a permanent successor.

MOVIE STARS ARE GIVEN MOTOR TRIP THROUGH VALLEY

The Frank Lloyd Production company, with a party of 23 movie stars including Robert Bosworth, Anna-Nilsson and Viola Dana, passed thru the Rogue River valley Sunday in two special cars, en route to Bel-lingham, Wash., then to Vancouver B. NEW POSTAL RATES START TOMORROW
