

FRENCH CABINET CRISIS RESTS ON SOCIALIST MOVE

PARIS, April 14.—By the Associated Press.—M. Briand, who yesterday was entrusted with the task of organizing a new cabinet, called on President Doumergue today and asked for more time in which to select his ministers. The crisis was brought on by the resignation of the Herriot cabinet after the senate had expressed dissatisfaction with the government's fiscal regime. Briand appeared determined to have no power behind the throne and wants to know definitely whether the socialists are willing to bind themselves to his leadership, reversing the previous decision of the party never to take office in a bourgeois cabinet.

By tomorrow night, it is expected the national committee of the socialist party will have made up its mind.

Many senators and deputies of all parties maintain that political questions should, at least for the moment, be laid aside that the country is in a tragic position which must be met by the employment of exceptional measures. For this reason a transitional ministry headed by Anatole De Monzie, who became minister of finance in the Herriot cabinet succeeding M. Clementel, on a week before the cabinet resigned, is growing in favor in political circles.

The sole aim of such a ministry, it is explained, would be to regularize the position of the Bank of France, which it became known during the financial debates last week, exceeded the legal limit of circulation to tide over a critical period.

At noon the impression in parliamentary circles was that M. Briand would decline the offer of the premiership either this evening or tomorrow.

NAVAL SEAPLANES PLAN FLIGHT TO HAWAII AS TEST

WASHINGTON, April 14.—Naval seaplanes of a newly developed long distance scouting type will be tested by the navy department this summer in a non-stop flight from California to Hawaii, the longest sustained flight ever attempted over water by heavier than air craft. Naval surface craft, however, probably will be stationed over the more than 2000 mile space of water to serve as protection for the fliers.

Arrangements for the flight are now being worked out with indications that it will be undertaken late in June or early in July.

Either San Diego or San Francisco will be the take-off point with Honolulu as the objective.

The test will follow the fleet and aircraft maneuvers in the vicinity of Hawaii, of the next few weeks and will proceed as the navy is undertaking another experiment with the aircraft—the exploration of unknown Arctic regions in co-operation with the MacMillan expedition.

If the new planes fulfill expectations the flight to Hawaii will mark an important step in the development of the future defense plans. Designed to operate from a land base, patrol aircraft of such cruising radius it is pointed out, could be utilized for extensive scouting about the Panama canal, through the Caribbean, as well as off the Atlantic coast and Hawaii.

BUDLONGS TOGETHER, BUT SILENT ON THEIR SEPARATION PLANS

NEWPORT, R. I., April 14.—Although it became known last night that Mrs. Jesse Margaret Budlong had Saturday filed a suit seeking separate maintenance from her husband, Milton J. Budlong, the couple spent the afternoon and much of the evening together in Newport. They would make no statement of their plans.

Mrs. Budlong, who last February lost her suit for divorce and was denied custody of the two boys, arrived in Newport Saturday afternoon. Just before the office of the clerk of courts was closed she quietly filed the new petition. Sunday morning she went alone from the boarding house at which she was staying to the Easter services at Trinity church where one of her sons sings in the choir. Her husband and the other son came in later and were seated in another pew.

In the afternoon Mr. Budlong and the elder boy drove to the home of Mrs. Budlong. The boy went in and after a few minutes was followed by the father, carrying two boxes of flowers. A little later Mrs. Budlong came out with them, carrying a small suitcase. They drove about Newport.

The Budlongs were married 25 years ago. Following the loss of her suit for divorce, Mrs. Budlong locked herself in a room of her husband's apartment in New York and remained for eight days, without food.

She left on February 21 in Budlong's automobile and has been in retirement since.

GERMAN BOURGEOIS BLOC IS FORMED

BERLIN, April 14.—(By the Associated Press.)—Count Frederick Von Loebell, chairman of the nationalist bourgeois bloc, said in an interview today that the nomination of Field Marshal Von Hindenburg for the presidency must be viewed as initiating a concerted movement to restore a bourgeois regime in Germany. It would thereby, he said, eliminate the powerful socialist party from future participation in government affairs, and incidentally prevent the perpetuation of coalitions comprising socialists, democrats and centrists.

"The construction of a national bourgeois bloc was originally conceived for the purpose of neutralizing conflicting aims and currents among non-socialistic parties," he said.

LAST DIGNATARY OF IMPERIAL RUSSIA BURIED MID POMP

MOSCOW, April 14.—(By the Associated Press.)—The funeral of the Most Rev. Dr. Tikhon, first patriarch of the Russian orthodox church since Peter the Great and the last great figure of imperial Russia took place yesterday. With imposing ceremony the casket containing the body was placed under the concrete floor of the Donskoy monastery, to which he was banished in 1922 by the civil authorities after 18 months' imprisonment.

Almost the entire clergy of Moscow and neighboring cities, including five metropolitan, 200 archbishops and bishops and priests participated in the majestic Slavonic liturgy which accompanied the burial.

At the end of the church services which really had been in progress day and night for almost a week, the clergy were on the point of collapse from sheer exhaustion. Several thousands of persons crowded into the little chapel where the body lay in state and remained standing throughout the long five hour requiem. In the Russian churches there are no pews and all persons stand as a symbol that all are equal before the Lord.

Outside the church the high walls of the Donskoy monastery looked down upon a multitude of people, which in numbers probably had never been equaled since 1812 when Napoleon's legions swept into the ancient shrine in search of plunder.

ENGLISH ACTRESS SLAIN BY LOVER IN JEALOUS RAGE

LONDON, April 14.—A story of fatal jealousy was told in police court today when Ernest Rhodes, 18 year old valet, appeared to answer a charge of murdering Grace Blackaller, pretty sixteen year old actress and dancing instructor who died Friday from the effects of a slash in the throat, the night previous in the West Kensington district. A statement was read into the records, alleged to have been made by Rhodes to the police, admitting he had cut the girl's throat with a razor.

The fatal act, as recorded in the statement was committed impulsively in a fit of jealousy as he was bidding the young dancer good night outside her home on her return from a motion picture theater and she chaffed him about other boys she might see during the Easter holidays. Rhodes said he was not aware he had slashed the girl fatally as she ran to her mother's home nearby and he did not know when she was dead until two days later when he read the news in the papers. He then surrendered to the police. Rhodes was remanded for a week.

GRAND FLEET WILL SAIL WEDNESDAY

SAN FRANCISCO, April 14.—(By the Associated Press.)—The program of entertainment arranged for the personnel of the United States grand fleet which leaves Wednesday for extensive maneuvers in Hawaiian waters and a trip to Australia, practically was concluded, as officers and men of the armada will be occupied tomorrow

SAN RAFAEL, Cal., April 14.—Two men believed to be Floyd Hall and Joe Tanko, escaped murderers from San Quentin, state prison, held up Nels Peterson, while he was driving home in Santa Rosa last night bound and gagged him and then carried him in the car along a crowded highway to Novato, 25 miles south of Santa Rosa, where they tied him to a tree. They then drove off in the machine.

The bandits robbed Peterson of everything but his knife. He managed to work this out of his pocket and cut his thumbs with it. He then walked to Petaluma, ten miles distant, where he notified the police. One of the men had a pistol, Peterson said.

Sheriff J. J. Keating of this county was notified and rushed to Petaluma with a posse. New posses were formed in Petaluma.
