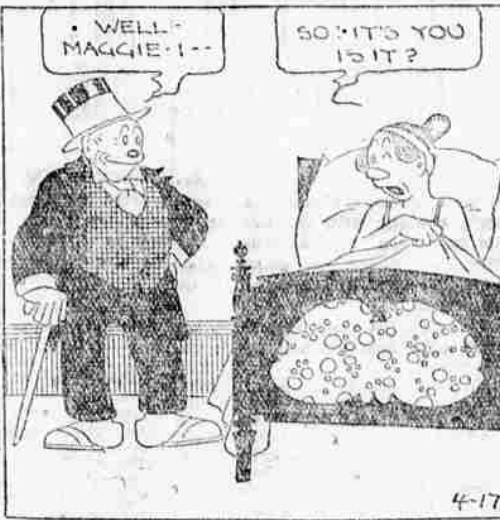
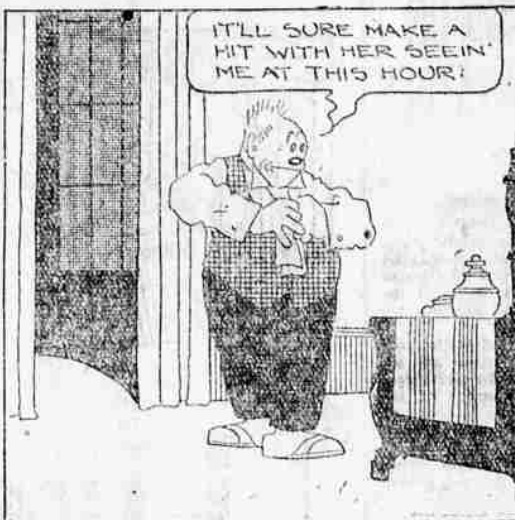


BRINGING UP FATHER

School District Bond Election Notice, for School District No. 49, of Jackson County, Oregon

Notice is hereby given, that at the school district bond election, hereby called to be held at the High School building, in Medford, Jackson county, Oregon, on May 5th, 1925, in and for said school district, between the hours of two o'clock p. m. and seven o'clock p. m., of said date, there will be submitted to the legal voters of said school district No. 49, the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of One Hundred Eighty-five Thousand (\$185,000.00) Dollars, and to issue its negotiable coupon bonds in said sum bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, for the purpose of constructing and equipping a high school, or a true thereof, in and for said district, and to purchase the real property necessary for said purpose.

The vote upon this question shall be by ballot upon which there shall be written the words "Bonds—yes," and "Bonds—no," and the voter shall place a cross (X) between the words "Bonds—Yes," or between the words "Bonds—No," which indicates his choice.

Polls for the reception of the ballots cast for or against the contracting of said indebtedness, will on said day and date, and at the place aforesaid, be opened at the hour of two o'clock p. m., and will remain open until the hour of seven o'clock p. m., of said date, at which time the polls shall be closed.

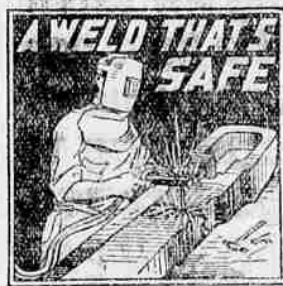
