ARMY OFFICERS HERE TO SELECT A RIFLE RANGE

Major A. C. Baker and Lieutenants H. W. Smith and K. D. Dufur of Portland arrived in Medford Friday evening and will spend two or three days selecting an artillery range to be used for practice during the encampment June 12 to 26.

It will require a four-mile range as the artillery will use guns from the smallest up to 75 millimeter, and the range will be in the Roxy Anne district or on the Rogue River Canal Co. desert property.

Major Baker will also install the proposed new company at Grants Pass that will attend the Medford encampment.

The visiting army officers met with the new Chamber of Commerce directors last night and discussed the coming encampment.
