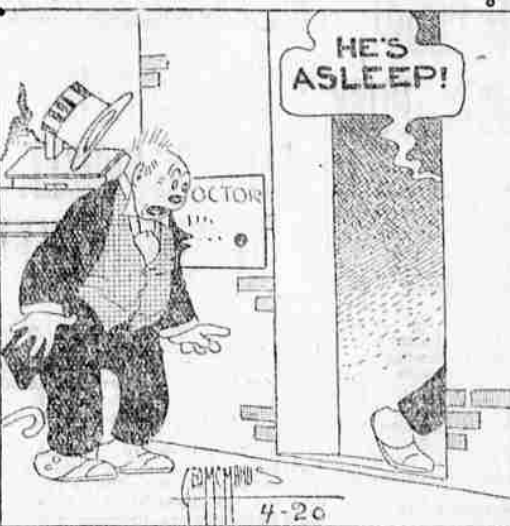
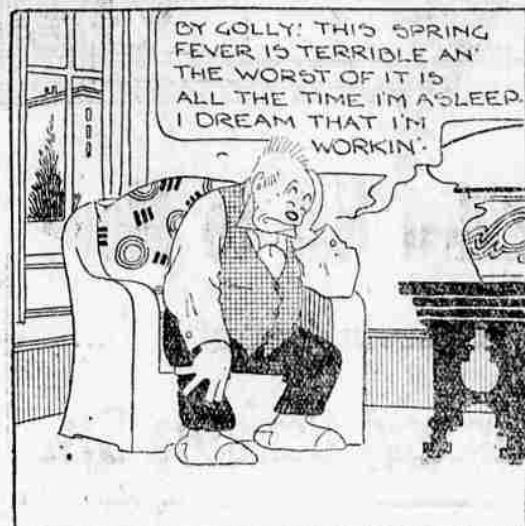


BRINGING UP FATHER

LOCAL RANCHER IS
SUED FOR \$2600
ON 1924 CONTRACT

A reply to the answer of the defendant was filed Saturday in the circuit court, in the suit of the Earl Fruit company, against Chris Gottlieb. The fruit company seeks 10 cents per box for 2600 boxes, raised on the Gottlieb orchard tract last year, claiming that it holds a contract for the delivery of the crop, which was sold to another company.

Gottlieb in his answer holds that the contract was only for one year, and the Earl company holds it was for three years, in its reply, which also sets forth that the vice president would never have approved a one-year contract, or signed it.

The fruit company claims further that it is not bound by the word of an agent when it annuls the contract terms.

Gottlieb now seeks a reformation of the contract, which the fruit company asks to be stopped.

Two hundred and sixty dollars, and the costs of the action are asked against Gottlieb.
