## BABY CLINIC TO BE HELD FRIDAY, PUBLIC LIBRARY

A baby welfare clinic will be held in the basement of the Public Library in Medford, Friday, April 24, from 2 to 5 p. m. Dr. V. S. Gearey, county health officer, and Dr. W. W. P. Holt will examine the babies assisted by Miss Vera Beard and Miss Irene Mann of Jackson County Health Unit.

Children up to 6 years of age will be registered. Registration can be made by appointment only. A physical examination will be made of each child including weighing and measuring. No child with a rash or cold will be admitted. Mrs. Leonard Carpenter and Mrs. E. G. Burgess of the Jackson County Public Health association will assist with the records.

This is the first of a series of baby welfare clinics to be held the last Friday of each month in Medford. The clinic is the third, permanent clinic of this type to be established in Oregon and it is hoped that it will be of material benefit to the people of Jackson county. During the summer other clinics will be held at various points in the county so as to be easily accessible to all people in the county.

All mothers with children up to the school age should make appointments by telephoning. The Jackson County Health Unit, Jacksonville 491, before Friday.

OMAHA, Neb., April 22.—Not deathless wars but something approximating them, will some day be waged, Major General Amos A. Fries, chief of the chemical warfare service of the United States army, told newspaper men here yesterday.

Chemical warfare, the general said, is not being developed along the line of attaining great and sudden loss of life.

"Rather," he continued, "it is being developed whereby wars and battles may be won without great loss of life, without working permanent injury to the people of cities which may be attacked—but to incapacitate such cities and peoples that may be taken."

"Human life is of greater value in warfare today than it has ever been in history."

"The World War was the most humane General Fries declared. The wars of ancient times were wars of horror and casualty. Only two deaths occurred from every 100 persons killed," he said, "while 25 deaths resulted from the same number of individuals struck by bullets or high explosive shells."

## SPORTS JACK DEMPSEY IS SICK OF MOVIES, NOT OF FIGHTING

OMAHA, Neb., April 22.—Heavyweight Champion Jack Dempsey, who with his wife, formerly Estelle Taylor, moving picture actress, passed through Omaha last night en route to New York to put the finishing touches on a picture in which the two are playing, declared that he and his manager, Jack Kearns, are "not on the outs."

"He is my fight manager," Dempsey said, "and when he gets me a fight then I will fight, but not until. He is my manager and we have not split our partnership."

"I am a little over-weight at present," the champion said. "I tip the beam around the two hundred mark, but hard work will bring me down to my regular fighting weight."

"I like to train and I like to fight. This movie work doesn't make a bit with me, but you know, it's better than loafing around doing nothing."

Dempsey said he didn't think his manager had any fights in view. "I will see Tex Rickard when I arrive in New York," he said, "but as far as talking 'fight' is concerned, that's up to my manager."

"I don't think I will sign another movie contract soon," he said in response to a question. "Fighting is my business, not acting in the movies."

"But Jack makes a good actor," Mrs. Dempsey said with a smile.

Following completion of their pictures in New York, Mr. and Mrs. Dempsey expect to visit Europe on their honeymoon, after which they will return to their home in California.

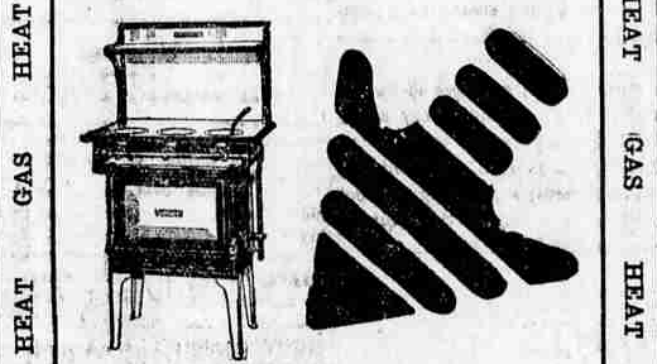
