

CHAMBER OF C. FAVORS AIR MAIL PACIFIC COAST

The Medford Chamber of Commerce appreciates the necessity of a north and south air mail service between Seattle and San Diego. This is absolutely essential the chamber says for the business interests of the Pacific coast irrespective of any connections that are made with the east and west bound mail service between New York and San Francisco.

A recent communication from a high officer in the air service reads as follows:

"It has always been gratifying to know that Medford has been of material assistance in organizing this airway by supplying a landing field, and making available a ready supply of gasoline for airplanes passing through. It is the usual stopping place for our planes traveling north from here, and I am in hopes that facilities there can be further extended by the establishment of a real municipal airport—aside from the present flying field—with radio communication facilities, gas and oil supply on the field, hangars and repair shops. Many other cities along the airway are actively taking up this matter and we expect to have a number of municipal airports on the ground in the near future.

It is logical that a good municipal airport would attract the air mail as, of course, they want proper facilities for handling their planes."

It is only a question of time before this service will be established. The cities, and communities, and business interests of the Pacific coast from San Diego to Seattle must unite in a demand on congress for the necessary funds to bring about this service without delay. The California Oregon Power company is one of the institutions that is taking an active interest in this matter, both from the standpoint of actual benefit to be derived from improved mail service, and because of the help that it will be to the territory at large.

Most of the cities on the Pacific coast that have taken up the air mail issue have done so with the idea of individually tying in to the New York-San Francisco scheme. Medford's plan is to present a united appeal for north and south service in which all can equally join, and let the tie-in with the New York-San Francisco service adjust itself by whatever method seems best in the light of future experience.

FARM ORGANIZER SUES HENRY FORD

DETROIT, Mich., April 22.—Henry Ford and the Dearborn Publishing company, of which he is owner, were named defendants in a \$1,000,000 libel suit filed today in United States district court by Aaron Sapiro, originator of a plan of co-operative marketing for farmers.

In the declaration filed by William O. Gallagher, attorney, Sapiro alleges that articles defamatory to his character have appeared in the Dearborn Independent. The articles, the declaration alleges, charged Sapiro with being one of "a conspiracy of Jewish bankers who seek to control the food markets of the world."
