The Dramatic club is putting on a one-act play entitled "Thursday Night." This is to start the evening's entertainment at 8 o'clock after which the other organizations will run their shows in competition with each other. Each has something to offer in the line of bunk and the most successful group in accomplishing this is to receive a free ride on the Jacksonville trolley-line at their own risk. The rooms of the building will be occupied each by a different show and several are going to sell "rats." Some or all of the following clubs and classes will have concessions: the Girls' Quartet, the H. E. C. A. club, the "Farmers" or the Agriculture boys, the Tri-M club, and the four classes, Fresh, Soph, Junior, and Senior.

Three years ago the high school put on a carnival, "Hi-Jinks," which was very well received and it is hoped that the one to be put on Friday night will be as successful.
