COOLEY AND NEFF BUILDING STORE ON N. CENTRAL

The building boom now on in Medford, which is the greatest the city has had for several years, will be increased by the erection of another building on the northwest corner of Sixth and Central, just north of the Medford Center building.

The structure, to be built by Messrs. Cooley and Neff, will be a modern concrete one, 50x75 feet, one story high at present, and will have four rooms fronting on Sixth and two with Central avenue fronts. Two of these rooms have already been leased, one for a men's furnishing store by a new firm.

This is the fourth business structure to be built in Medford during the past year by J. H. Cooley and Porter J. Neff, the Craterian theater, Mason-Ehrman Wholesale grocery, Gates & Lydard Economy groceries and this new building.

This is also another addition to North Central avenue, which is growing rapidly.
