DANCING GIRL ON THE STAND AGAIN

BOMBAY, India, April 29.—(By the Associated Press)—Mumtaz Begum today continued her ordeal on the witness stand during the third session of the trial of the nine men accused of murdering her protector, Abdul Kadir Baula, rich Mohammedan merchant. The former favorite of the Maharaja of Indore, declared that Baula supplied her with ample funds and that she found greater happiness in his house than at the maharaja's palace in Indore. The maharaja, she said, was not sincere when he said she could leave his household whenever she pleased. Mumtaz admitted that she did not tell the maharaja she wanted to leave him. She escaped from Indore because of her baby's death, she said. Answering a question from the counsel, Mumtaz said "a female child was born to me, but a nurse killed it."
