

RETURN OF BANK DEPT. TO SALEM AGAIN DEMANDED

SALEM, Ore., April 30.—Following a formal demand made April 6, District Attorney John H. Carson today filed in the circuit court here a petition for an alternative writ of mandamus requiring Frank C. Brumwell, state superintendent of banks, to return the state banking department from Portland to Salem. The petition is on relation of George Putnam, publisher of the Capital Journal, who made the demand of the district attorney.

Salem A. Kozier, secretary of state, is also made a defendant in the case and the petition demands that he furnish quarters for the department in Salem. The proceedings cite the law which requires that the state banking department have its offices in Salem. The banking code was amended by the 1925 legislature but when the amended code goes into effect May 28, it will still require the department to have its offices in Salem, only a branch office being allowed in Portland under the amended code.

The present law covering the case says that "the state bank examiner shall maintain his office in the city of Salem, and the secretary of state is hereby required to furnish suitable quarters therefor."

The new code, effective May 28, says: "The superintendent of banks shall maintain his office in the city of Salem and the secretary of state is hereby required to furnish suitable quarters therefor, provided the superintendent of banks, when considered by him to be expedient, or convenient, may establish branch offices in the city of Portland."

Since the removal of the department to Portland about March 24, the superintendent of banks has established a desk in the state house and occasionally a clerk of the department comes to Salem.

This, says the petition filed today, "is a subterfuge and is for the purpose only of making it appear that the superintendent of banks and the said banking department maintain an office in the said city of Salem."

APPEAL DENIED IN CANNING CO. SUIT

SALEM, Ore., April 30.—The supreme court has denied a motion to dismiss the appeal in the case of Vawter against the Rogue River Valley Canning company, on appeal from Jackson county. Vawter is appellant.

The above action was a "friendly suit," instituted by the Jackson county bank against the Rogue River Valley Canning company for collection of a lien for approximately \$1100. The object of the suit was to determine the responsibility for the payment of the lien. At the time, the canning company and the bank and Skeels mill were allied concerns, the books of one concern showing it had been paid, and the books of the other concern showing it had not. The \$1100 was later paid to the bank, and the suit was brought to settle the difference in bookkeeping. Last fall a verdict was rendered in favor of the bank in the circuit court, and an appeal taken.

OREGON WOOLMEN SEE A RISING MARKET

PENDLETON, Ore., April 30.—More wool will be shipped out of Umatilla county this year to outside markets on consignment than ever before in the history of the industry, according to Mac Hoke, secretary of the Oregon Wool Growers' association. The present weakness of the market and the confidence of growers that the price of wool will come back are the chief factors that have led many growers to decide to consign their wool. Mr. Hoke declared a quarter of a million pounds of wool produced by Fred W. Falconer, in various companies, has already been contracted for consignment to a Boston firm. In addition, Mr. Falconer will send quite a shipment to Portland to be put in warehouses. Shipments made to Boston this year are expected to go by way of Portland by rail and water, due to the fact that the combined rail and water rate is approximately one cent a pound less than the rail rate.

New Hatchery on Umpqua
PORTLAND, Ore., April 29.—Construction of a new fish hatchery on Rock creek, a tributary of the Umpqua river was authorized yesterday by the state fish commission. The hatchery will be ready for use in the fall and will care for about 8,000,000 eggs.

Notice is hereby given, that an election will be held in School District No. 49, at the High School Building in Medford, Jackson County, Oregon, on the 19th day of May, 1925, in and for said district, between the hours of two o'clock p. m. and seven o'clock p. m., of said date, at which time there will be submitted to the legal voters of said school district, the question of the selection or rejection of one of the following described premises on which to construct a high school building, or a unit thereof.

The Pacific & Eastern site is described as follows:

Resolution No. 63.

A resolution calling a special election on Saturday, May 16, 1925, for the submission to the legal voters of the City of Medford, Oregon, of a proposed act of municipal legislation changing the city's boundaries so as to incorporate therein certain additional territory adjacent to the present boundaries and submitting said proposed act of municipal legislation thereat.

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Medford, Oregon:

Section 1. That there be, and hereby is called a special election in and for the City of Medford, Oregon, in the territory hereinafter proposed to be annexed thereto, to be held on the 16th day of May, 1925, for the purpose of submitting thereat to the qualified voters of said city, a proposed act of municipal legislation changing the city's boundaries so as to incorporate therein certain additional territory adjacent to the present boundaries. Said election is hereby ordered to be held on the above date and between the hours of 1:00 o'clock p. m. and 7:00 o'clock p. m., as provided by the city charter of said city and the state law for regular elections.

Section 2. That the following places are hereby designated as the polling places for each ward at which said election will be held:

First Ward: Public Market, South Riverside Ave.

Second Ward: Washington school, corner W. 4th and Oakdale Ave.

Third Ward: Fichtner's Garage, Corner North Fir and Sixth St.

Fourth Ward: City Hall, corner North Front and Sixth St.

In addition to the regular polling places as designated herein the following are hereby designated as the places in the territory proposed to be annexed at which the polls will be opened from 1:00 o'clock to 7:00 o'clock p. m. of said day:

Residence of Mrs. Lena Roseberry on West Second Street.

Residence of Mrs. Carrie M. Rickert, Capitol Hill Addition.

Section 5. That there be, and hereby is submitted and proposed to the legal voters of the City of Medford, Oregon for their approval or rejection at said special election held on the 16th day of May, 1925, the following proposed act of municipal legislation changing the boundaries of the City of Medford so as to incorporate certain additional territory adjacent to the present boundaries.

Section 1. That Section 2 of Chapter 1 of the Charter of the City of Medford, Oregon, changing the city's boundaries so as to incorporate therein certain additional territory adjacent to the present boundaries.

Section 2. The geographical limits and boundaries of said city shall be as follows: Beginning at a point at the intersection of the center line of North Central Avenue and McAndrews Street and from said intersection point running thence northerly along the west line of Bunker Hill Addition to the northwest corner thereof; thence easterly along the north boundary of Bunker Hill Addition to the northeast corner thereof; thence southerly along the east boundary of Bunker Hill Addition to the intersection of the center line of McAndrews Street; thence easterly along the center line of McAndrews Street to its intersection with the northerly projection of the west line of Court Street extended; thence north on a line thirty feet west of the west line of Court Street extended, and parallel thereto, and said line extended to its intersection with the section line between Sections 13 and 24, Township 37, S. R. 2 West of the Willamette Meridian; thence running easterly on said section line to its intersection with the east line of the P. & E. Railroad right of way as heretofore laid out; thence south along the east line of said P. & E. Railroad right of way to its intersection with the westerly projection of the north line of Sunrise Home Park Addition; thence east on said line to its intersection with the center line of Crater Lake Avenue; thence north along the center line of Crater Lake Avenue to the northwest corner of Laurelhurst Addition; thence east along the north line of Laurelhurst Addition to the northeast corner thereof, being the southeast corner of the southeast quarter of Section 19, Township 37, S. R. 1 West of the Willamette Meridian; thence south along the section line between Sections 19 and 20, Township 37, S. R. 1 West of the Willamette Meridian; thence east along the section line between Sections 20 and 29, Township 37, S. R. 1 West of the Willamette Meridian; thence east along said section line to the quarter section corner of said Section 20 and 29, thence north to the northwest corner of Capitol Hill Addition, being the northwest corner of the southwest quarter of said Section 20; thence east along the north line of Capitol Hill Addition to a point directly north of the northeast corner of the city reservoir site, as described in deed records Volume 71 at page 531, thereof; thence south along the east line of the city reservoir site to the southeast corner thereof; thence east to the northeast corner of the El Mar Addition now vacated; thence south along the east line of El Mar Addition, between said Sections 20 and 29; thence east to the section corner of Sections 20, 21, 23 and 29, Township 37, S. R. 1 West of the Willamette Meridian; thence south along the section line between said Sections 28 and 29 to the south side of the county road; thence west along the south line of the county road to the northwest corner of Siskiyou Heights Extension; thence south along the east line of Siskiyou Heights Extension to the southeast corner of Block five (5) of said addition; thence westerly along the county line of block five, by and by the city charter thereof across block four (4) to its intersection with Windsor Avenue, and the south line of Oakwood Drive; thence westerly along the south line of Oakwood Drive to its intersection with the east line of Barnburg Road, being the east line of Siskiyou Heights Addition; thence southerly along the west line of Siskiyou Heights Extension to its intersection with the south line of D.
