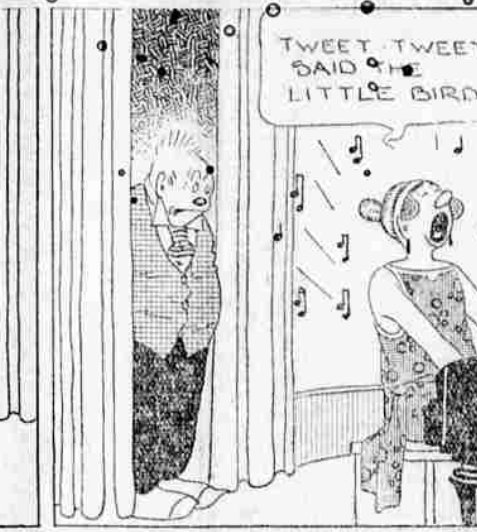
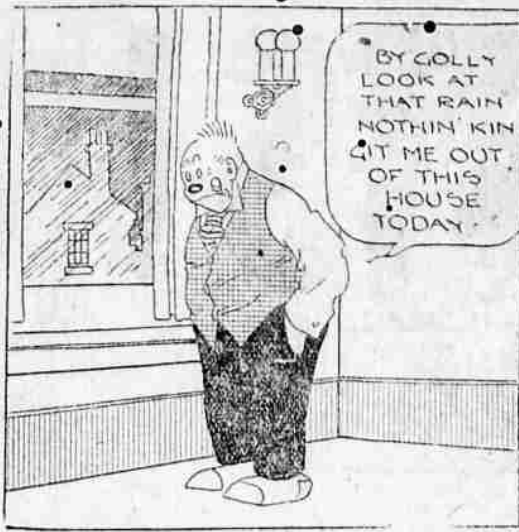

The vote upon this question shall be by ballot upon which there shall be written the words: "Bonds—Yes" and "Bonds—No," and the voter shall place a cross (X) between the words: "Bonds—Yes," or between the words: "Bonds—No," which indicates his choice.

Polls for the reception of the ballots cast for or against the contracting of said indebtedness, will on said day and date, and at the place aforesaid, be opened at the hour of two o'clock p. m. and will remain open until the hour of seven o'clock p. m. of said date, at which time the polls shall be closed.
