SCORES KILLED IN R. R. WRECK IN PRUSSIA

SCHNEIDMUEHL, Prussia, May 1.—(By the Associated Press)—The Ekdtkuhnen-Berlin express was derailed early this morning in the Pollah corridor between Swaroschin and Starogard, killing between 30 and 40 persons and injuring two more.

BERLIN, May 1.—Dispatches received here from Schneidmuehl said that the count showed 24 killed and 20 injured in the wreck today of the Ekdtkuhnen-Berlin express. It was reported that the accident was due to an unidentified person having removed the bolts from cross-ties under the rails.
