

DRY FLEET, ARMED TO TEETH, START COAST OFFENSIVE

NEW YORK, May 4.—Units from the coast guard of the entire Atlantic seaboard with the revenue cutters Gresham, Seneca and Mohave, were mobilized at the Clifton coast guard base in Staten Island today for a new war of extermination against rum fleets lying off the coast from New Jersey to Connecticut.

The fleet comprises more than sixty vessels. Armed, maintained and equipped as though for battle, most of them are motor craft between forty and sixty feet long, and capable of great speed.

The fleet, which is expected to put to sea tomorrow, will operate under orders to shoot first and investigate afterward in the case of suspected rum runners.
