UTAH COMPANY IS BUILDING PLANT IN GRANTS PASS

GRANTS PASS, May 9.—(Special)

From appearances, Grants Pass is destined to be the center of a very important development in the near future, and the reason for such a statement lies in things happening about a month since several Utah gentlemen came to Grants Pass, and without ado or demands for local aid as is quite usual, set about the acquisition of a site and the erection of a measurable sized plant. The site they selected is immediately east of the California and Oregon coast railroad on the south side of the Rogue river, and can be reached by turning off the main highway to the east and to the south of the city park and fair grounds.

On this site now there rests the main building, altogether enclosed so particularly located as to take advantage of gravity flow in processing. It is stated that barring unforeseen contingencies all equipment will be in place by the middle of this month and operation begun.

From authentic sources of information some salient facts are worthy of notice and of great interest to this locality, in case the sponsors' predictions for this enterprise prove out. Their sincerity can hardly be questioned, and they invite investigation and observation.

The parent organization controlling the Croner process is a Utah incorporation known as the Metals Extraction and Refining corporation. The move was engineered to establish a recovery plant here from a knowledge of the extensive black sand deposits and other value retaining materials inherent in this locality.

The so-called "Croner Process" is an improved amalgamation method from recovering gold and platinum from sands and other materials where the metal elements are free to move. Irrespective of any corrosion, rust or film coverings of these metals, there are well substantiated claims for practically complete recoveries. If this is proven it will obviously inject values into placer and other properties heretofore latent, and bring into activity a very large field of great importance.

Numerous questions have been about since this recovery plant took birth, and which may be of importance to those of our readers who either are producing gold and platinum concentrates or contemplate doing so.

This Grants Pass property is erected to furnish a commercial outlet of recovery of the rich metals and on a commission or royalty basis of charge for the plant. Thus there is expected enough of a surrounding field of production of concentrates.

And through the operation of this establishment the owners will demonstrate practically the success and simplicity of the process and lay foundation for legitimate and prudent expansion. The per diem capacity for running concentrate in 50 tons. This plant does not contain any grinding facilities for quantity handling. Accessory to the process equipment, there is limited concentrating features, also an assay and refining room. The heads or concentrates for running will be received at the south end of the building and the tailing dump is beyond the river bed. The water for operating purposes is pumped by electrically driven pump from the river. The process involves the giving off of no fumes and the tailings hold nothing of a chemical nature that is harmful to man or beast. A railway spur track is planned to be built to the property in the near future. Local Mining News

Encourage Outside Capital.
Mining is a business and requires both capital and experience to prove successful. Southwestern Oregon has vast mineral wealth but capital and experience are requisite to a commercial success of the industry here, as elsewhere. Mining capital and experience go hand in hand, and we must look for both outside our own borders. In attempting to secure such capital we must overcome the prejudice existing locally against mining—a prejudice wholly unwarranted by the facts—and, in addition, encourage mining investors in every way possible.

The mine or prospect owner can do much to assist in securing adequate capital to develop our minerals provided he is willing, and he can do much to prevent capital coming into our midst, if he so desires. Upon him rests the responsibility to a large degree. His opportunity to aid lies in giving encouragement to mining investors by doing business along those lines well recognized by mining men and the industry generally.

Experienced mining capital moves along the lines of minimum risk, the same as experienced capital in other industries. Thorough investigation by competent engineers gives the mining investor reliable data to work on, and a tangible basis on which to take over a property for development or operation. The general practice of experienced mining capital is to be willing to pay the cost of developing an undeveloped property to determine whether same will make a producing mine or not, and in granting

the owner a fair and reasonable price for his property providing the property warrants taking it over after the development work is done, showing ore blocked out, determines largely whether the investor is warranted in paying any cash down, but usually a lease and bond for a reasonable term is the only way that capital will invest. Under such an arrangement the mine or prospect owner puts his property up against the development work to be done by the investor, fixing his price and terms in advance. If the development work proves the property valuable and the investor concludes to exercise his right to acquire same, the owner gets his price and the investor gets the property. If it does not stand up to the expectations of the investor, the owner gets the property back plus the development work done, and the investor loses the cost of the development work.

To Mining Men.

The southwestern Oregon Mining Bureau at its regular meeting last Saturday decided to establish a registry of all the mines and prospects in the district—Coo, Curry, Douglas, Lane, Jackson and Josephine counties, and in due time forms will be sent out to members to assemble the necessary information. This registry will be open to the inspection of mining investors, and every mine recorded therein will have an equal opportunity of attracting the atten-

tion of capital. The registry will be kept at Grants Pass. Mine owners who are not members of the bureau, necessary blanks, which will be asked to co-operate in making ready for distribution about May 15.

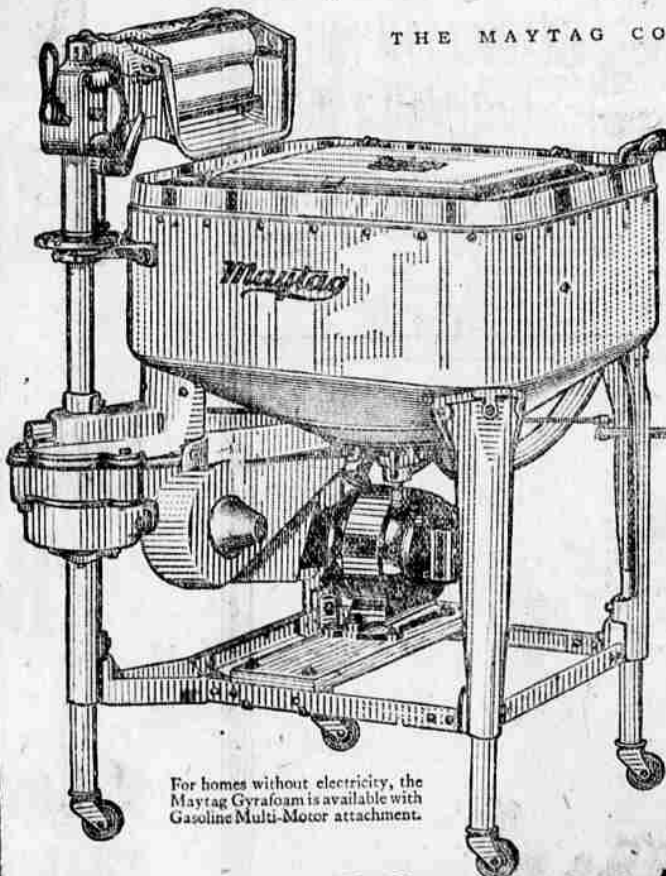
