BELOVED PIONEER WOMAN OF ROGUE RIVER PASSES ON

ROGUE RIVER, May 14.—Mrs. Mary F. White passed away Sunday morning at her home two miles southeast of Rogue River. Her death was caused by pneumonia, following an attack of flu. Mrs. White was an old resident of this community and has a host of friends who will miss her from our midst. She was born in Missouri October 21, 1862, and came to Jackson county when a small child and has lived here most of the time since. In 1878 she was married at Medford to Charles White, and to this union were born four sons. The father and two sons preceded her several years ago. Two sons and three grandchildren are left to mourn her loss, beside two brothers and one sister. The funeral was held at the home Wednesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, Rev. Gray officiating. Interment in the Rock Point cemetery. The Rebekahs had charge of the services at the grave. Funeral arrangements were in charge of Conger's funeral parlors of Medford. The bereaved family have the sympathy of the entire community.
