

CRIPPLED MOON-SHINER SENTENCED TO YEAR IN SALEM

R. A. Sears of the Eagle Point district, who pleaded guilty to possession of a still, and is a cripple and invalid, was sentenced to a year in state prison late yesterday by Circuit Judge C. M. Thomas. The court directed that the commitment order be held in abeyance for "three or four days."

In passing sentence, the court said that Sears presented a serious problem, on account of his physical condition.

"The county authorities," said the court, "feel that the real leaders and operators of the still are hiding behind you, and preventing justice, by using your unfortunate position as a shield."

The court suggested that Sears should reveal the names of his co-workers, but he stoutly maintained that he alone was to blame and explained his methods of getting the supplies and still equipment to the thicket where it was found.

Sears' story failed to impress the court, who in passing sentence told Sears that at the prison he would receive medical attention and care, the county was unable to give.

"As I understand it, I have three or four days to think it over," were Sears' words as he hobbled from the courtroom. He is at liberty on bonds. Sentencing of Leigh C. Wetmore, Copco timekeeper was postponed until next Thursday, to allow the court to further investigate certain angles of the case.
